

# **UPCOMING CHANGE**

## Hoisting Rigging: Training + Certification Requirements

REMINDER: Local Law 141 of 2013 (The 2014 Construction Codes) requires individuals engaged in hoisting rigging work – and who are not employed by a licensed rigger – to complete Department approved training or possess Department approved national certification by <u>July 1, 2016</u>.

Note: This notice does not apply to suspended scaffold operations. Please review the following service notices: Supervision of Suspended Scaffold Installation & Removal and Supervision of Suspended Scaffold Use for information about suspended scaffold training.

Note: This notice does not apply to the hanging or attaching of signs; the hanging or attaching of signs must be performed by or under the direct and continuing supervision of a licensed sign hanger.

Note: Certain types of hoisting rigging <u>must</u> be supervised by a licensed rigger with crews employed by the licensed rigger. Please see the following service update: <u>Rigging Supervision: Tower Crane</u>
Assembly, Jumping or Disassembly for further information.

## **Supervisors**

Beginning July 1, 2016, individuals who supervise the hoisting and lowering of articles on the outside of a building, <u>and who are not licensed as a rigger or employed by a rigger as a designated foreman</u>, must, at a minimum:

• Have completed a 32-Hour Rigging Supervisor course, and every four years thereafter, complete a 16-Hour Rigger Supervisor refresher course;

- OR -

 Possess valid certifications from the National Commission for the Certification of Crane Operators (NCCCO) for "Rigger Level II" and "Signalperson."

### **Crew members**

Beginning July 1, 2016, individuals who are not employed by a licensed rigger and who attach or detach loads from the hook of hoisting equipment in conjunction with the hoisting or lowering of an article on the outside of a building, as well as all signalpersons involved in such work, must, at a minimum:

 Have completed a 16-Hour Rigging Worker course, and every four years thereafter, complete a 8-Hour Rigging Worker refresher course;

– OR –

 Possess valid certifications from the National Commission for the Certification of Crane Operators (NCCCO) for "Rigger Level I" and "Signalperson."
