2020 NYC Energy Conservation Code in Effect

The 2020 New York City Energy Conservation Code (NYCECC) is in effect May 12, 2020, affecting all new buildings and alterations. All jobs filed on or after May 12, 2020 must comply with the 2020 NYCECC. For prior projects and Incomplete Filings, see Service Notice from February 2020.

NYCECC Forms

All jobs filed on or after May 12, 2020 must use the updated forms.

TR8: Technical Report Statement of Responsibility for Energy Code Progress Inspections

- The <u>TR8 Form</u> dated '05/20' updates required inspections for compliance with the 2020 NYCECC. For a detailed description of the inspection changes, see <u>2016 vs 2020 Progress Inspections</u> table.
- Effective May 12, 2020, all BIS jobs filed under the 2020 New York City Energy Conservation Code are required to use the TR8: Technical Report Statement of Responsibility for Energy Code Progress Inspections form dated 5/20. Forms with the 'September 2016' revision date will no longer be accepted for jobs filed under the 2020 New York City Energy Conservation Code.
- Jobs filed under the 2016 New York City Energy Conservation Code may continue to use the TR8
 with the 'September 2016' revision date to sign-off on inspections until a Certificate of Occupancy is
 issued by the Department.

EN1: Energy Modeling Compliance

- The EN1 Form dated '05/20' updates energy modeling analysis requirements for compliance with the 2020 NYCECC Appendix CA.
- Effective May 12, 2020, all jobs filed under the 2020 New York City Energy Conservation Code are required to use the EN1 Form dated 'May 2020'. Forms with the 'September 2016' revision date will no longer be accepted for jobs filed under the 2020 New York City Energy Conservation Code.
- Jobs filed under the 2016 New York City Energy Conservation Code may continue to use the <u>EN1 Form</u> with the 'September 2016' revision date.
