Follow up #1: Temporary Construction Equipment No Longer Requires a Final Inspection

A TR1 for Final Inspection is no longer required for EQ – Construction Equipment work types in BIS (Chute, Fence, Supported Scaffold, Sidewalk Shed, Support of Excavation, etc.) See [Local Law 146 of 2021](#).

The Final Required Item for BIS jobs has been waived through a system update where EQ is the only work type and the Required Item was auto-populated because the applicant selected Directive 14.

Request a Letter of Completion for BIS Jobs

The [PW7: Letter of Completion Request Form](#) has been revised to include a notification of removal of temporary construction equipment. To receive an LOC for temporary construction equipment, upload the signed PW7 in eFiling with the box for notification of removal checked.

3 TYPE OF REQUEST

- Letter of Completion (Directive 14 or Non-Directive 14)
- Notification of removal of chute, fence, supported scaffold, sidewalk shed, temporary hoist, support of excavation, or other temporary construction equipment. No final inspection is required per LL146/21.

Sidewalk Sheds Removal

Major Buildings

- Submit a Sidewalk Shed Removal Request in DOB NOW: *Build*. The shed can be removed once the request is approved in DOB NOW: *Build*.
- Submit a Sidewalk Shed Removal Notification in DOB NOW: *Build* no more than two business days following the complete removal of the sidewalk shed (Building Code Section 3307.6.5.11).
- To receive an LOC, upload the signed PW7 in eFiling with the box for notification of removal checked.

Non-major Buildings

- Submit a Sidewalk Shed Removal Notification in DOB NOW: *Build* no more than two business days following the complete removal of the sidewalk shed (Building Code Section 3307.6.5.11).
- To receive an LOC, upload the signed PW7 in eFiling with the box for notification of removal checked.
