The "Come Meet Elmhurst Hospital Nurses" program provided patients with the opportunity to meet the nurses who deliver their care at EHC.

The theme of the event was "Caring for YOU Today for a Healthier YOU Tomorrow." Event presenters emphasized how nurses at EHC provide excellent nursing care using the philosophy of human caring.
