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CCRB RELEASES 2023 SEMI-ANNUAL REPORT AND APU QUARTERLY REPORT

New York, NY – the New York City Civilian Complaint Review Board (CCRB) released two regular reports today updating the public on Agency operations.

The [2023 Semi-Annual Report](#) details complaint data for the first half of the year including number of complaints, types of allegations and location along with a section on the new Racial Profiling and Bias Based Policing Unit's investigations. The report also details all board recommendations and NYPD decisions for closed non-charges cases.

The Administrative Prosecution Unit releases [a quarterly report](#) updating the public on all charges cases closed in that quarter. The report contains information concerning the following case closures in the second quarter of 2023: twelve (12) trial verdicts, seventeen (17) pleas, three (3) retained cases, nine (9) PC administratively closed cases, forty-six (46) APU administratively closed cases. Finally, it includes information regarding the discipline and concurrence rates for the quarter which stand at 65% and 61% respectively.

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The New York City Civilian Complaint Review Board (CCRB) is the largest police oversight entity in the nation and is empowered to investigate, mediate, prosecute, and recommend disciplinary action for complaints alleging misconduct by NYPD officers. See NYC Charter § 440(c)(1). The agency's jurisdiction includes excessive and unnecessary force, abuse of authority, discourtesy, and use of offensive language. To further this mission, CCRB issues monthly, biannual, and special statistical and qualitative reports analyzing trends and recurring issues arising from the many thousands of civilian complaints it receives each year.
