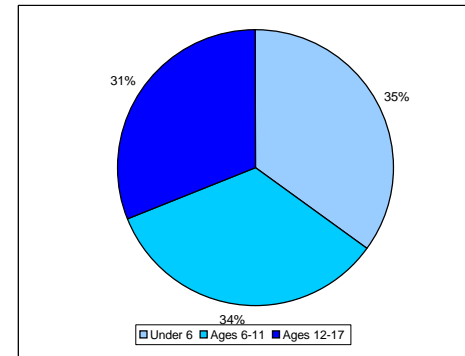

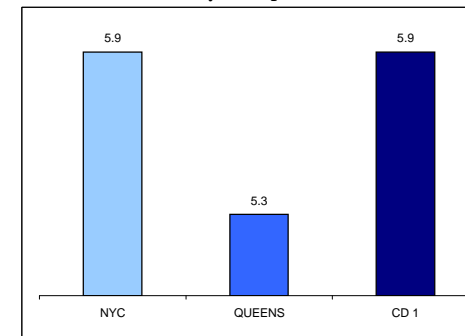

CD 1: Infant Mortality Rate per 1,000 Live Births

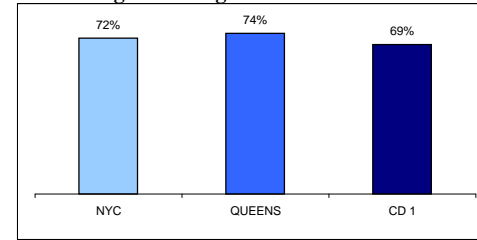

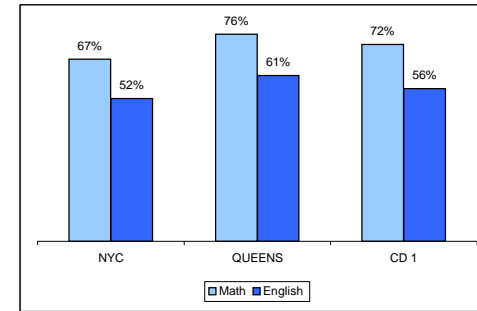
CD 1: Percent of People 25 and Older with High School Degrees or Higher

CD 1: Percent of Children Performing at or Above Grade Level



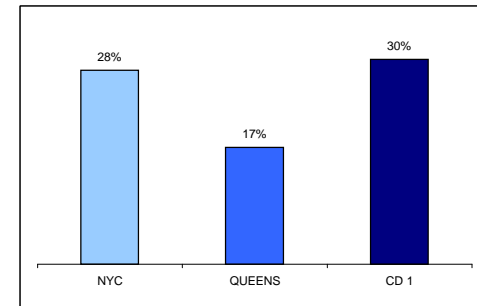

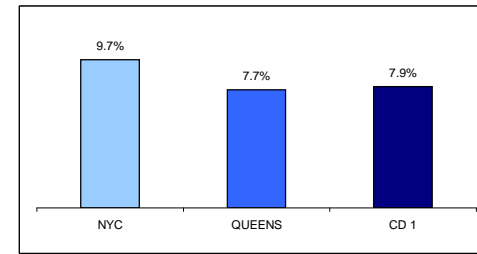

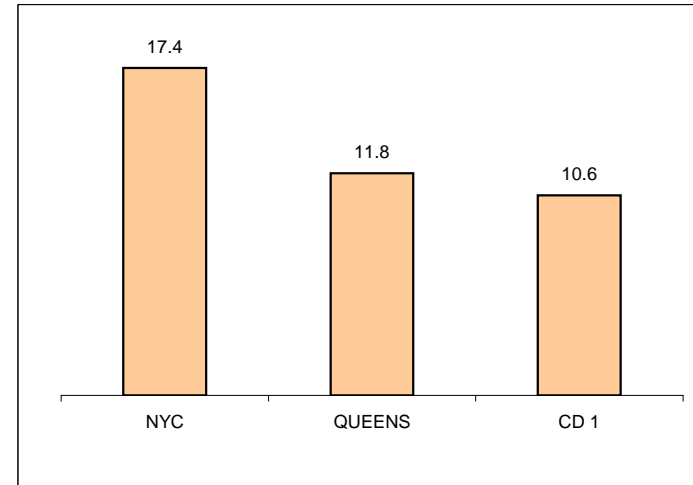

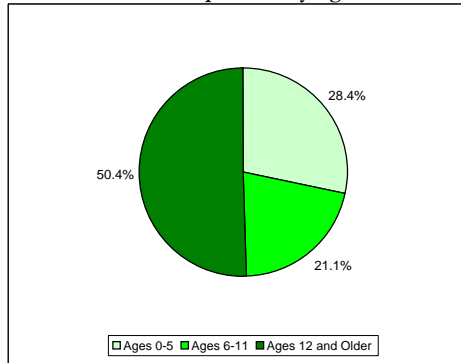

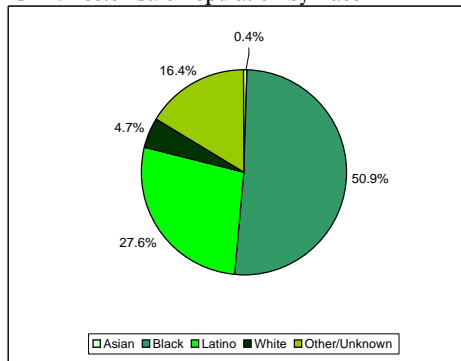

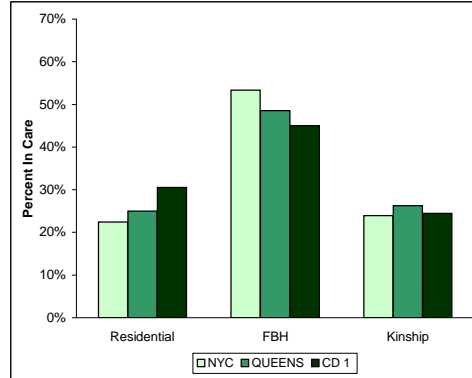

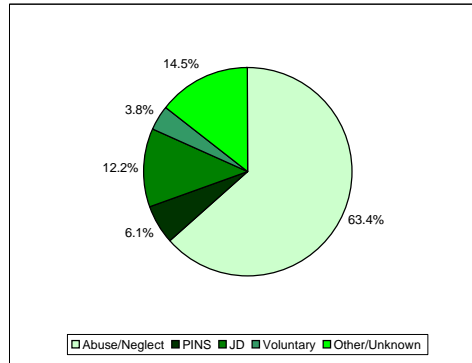

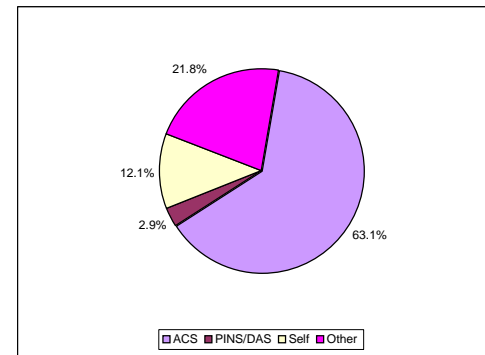

Demographics

- Totals may not always equal 100 due to rounding; also, borough totals may not exactly sum to the citywide totals, due to the method used for converting zip codes into community districts. In some cases zip codes include multiple community districts.

Source: The New York City Police Department, Statistical Report: 2007 Domestic Violence Arrests and Juvenile Arrests. Office of Management Analysis and Planning, 2007

Notes:

- Juvenile crime rate was calculated as the number of felony and misdemeanor arrests of youths 16 and under divided by the population of youths 16 and under multiplied by 1,000.
- Manhattan Police precincts 10, 13, 14, 17, & 18 share coverage of community districts 4, 5, & 6. The number of Juvenile Arrests reported by the precincts were apportioned according to the 16 year old and under population in Manhattan Community Districts 4, 5, and 6. The number of Domestic Violence Arrests reported were apportioned according to the total population in Manhattan Community Districts 4, 5, and 6.
- Number of Domestic Violence Arrests was compiled by the Domestic Violence Unit using DOMSTAT.

Performance at or Above Grade Level

Notes:

- Grade Level is defined as the percentage of children that scored at Level 3 and 4 on their State Math and ELA Performance Tests (grades 3-8).

Abuse and Neglect/ Victimization Rate/ Reabuse

Source: CONNECTIONS

Notes:

- Number of Abuse/Neglect Investigations is the total number of abuse/neglect investigations conducted by ACS in CY 2008. This count excludes reports which have been consolidated into one investigation according to criteria established by the New York State Office of Children and Family Services.
- Abuse/Neglect Indication rate is the percent of reports that have credible evidence of abuse or neglect determined upon investigation.
- Child Victimization Rate is calculated as the number of distinct children 17 and under with indicated reports divided by the number of youths 17 and under in New York City multiplied by 1,000.
- The repeat maltreatment rate is the percent of children with indicated investigations in CY 2007 followed by another indicated investigation within one year from the date of determination of the initial investigation.

Placements

Notes:

- Placement information is based on admissions to foster care in CY 2008.
- Placement Rate is calculated as the number of children placed into foster care at the age of 17 and under divided by the number of youths 17 and under in New York City multiplied by 1,000.
- Kinship Placement is placement provided by a relative up to the third degree.
- Community Placement is the percentage of children who were placed in their community district of origin or neighboring community district.
- The Percent Sibling Groups Placed Together is the percent of all placements involving children in sibling groups who were placed in family foster care on the same day with no other siblings already in care where all siblings were placed in the same home.

Notes:

- Percent Reunified within 1 Year of Placement is based on children admitted to foster care in CY 2007.
- The re-entry rate is the percent of foster care children discharged to family who re-enter foster care within one year of their discharge date.

Child Care

Source: ACS Division of Child Care and Head Start

Notes:

- Head Start data are the average enrollment for CY 2008.
- Child Care data reflect enrollment group day care programs contracting with ACS for CY2008. Children receiving services using ACS vouchers are not included in these figures.

Preventive Services

Source: PROMIS/ WMS

Notes:

- Families Receiving Purchased Preventive Services is estimated based on the number of contracted cases with address information as of December 2008.
- Referral Source Data is based on the number of preventive cases referred for services during CY 2008.
