COMMISSION DIRECTIVE

Dear Licensee or Registrant:

In observance of the anniversary of September 11th, street access will be restricted in the area of memorial services. Streets within the following perimeter in lower Manhattan will be closed:

- Areas bounded by Chambers Street on the North; Battery Place on the South; Broadway on the East; West Street on the West; All Inclusive
- Washington Street between Liberty Street and Battery Place
- Church Street/Trinity Place between Reade Street and Morris Street
- Morris Street between West Street and Washington Street
- State Street between Battery Place and Whitehall Street
- Liberty Street between Broadway and Nassau Street
- Liberty Street between West Street and South End Avenue
- Cedar Street between Broadway and Nassau Street
- Pine Street between Broadway and Nassau Street
- Nassau Street between Liberty Street and Pine Street

Accordingly, YOU ARE HEREBY DIRECTED to remove all waste on the streets above before 9:00 pm on Saturday, September 10, 2011. No waste may be collected between 9:00 pm Saturday, September 10, 2011 and 10:00 pm Sunday, September 11, 2011. Uniformed BIC officers will be onsite to ensure compliance with this Directive. A map of the affected area and a copy of this Directive are available at nyc.gov/bic.

You are also advised that a NYC Department of Transportation construction embargo is in effect in the above area and additional streets. See nyc.gov/dot for more information about container permits and the construction embargo.

Failure to abide by this Directive may result in administrative fines up to \$10,000 (*See*, 17 RCNY §1-09), and may be considered in evaluating the status of your company's License or Registration.
