Dear Ms. Scavo,

As provided in Section 41:34 of the Mental Hygiene Law, please consider this letter as formal notification of the interest and intent of Women's League, under the auspices of the New York State Office of People With Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) to establish a community residence for three developmentally disabled persons at the above address.

As you may already be aware, community residences, are being developed throughout New York State so that individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities reside in local communities accessible to normal life-enriching experiences close to their family and friends. These three individuals are people from the local community who are in need of a new home. Each person living in the residence will attend a program at a sheltered workshop or school each weekday. There will be supervisory and residential staff on duty 24 hours a day at the residence, with recreational activities and programs planned for evenings and weekends.

As per Section 41:34, you are required to forward any comments of your Community Board concerning this site within forty (40) days of receipt of this notification. You may either: (1) approve the site recommended; (2) suggest one or more alternate sites; or (3) object to the establishment of a residence at the site because to do so in your Board's opinion, would result in such a concentration of residential facilities that the nature and character of the neighborhood would be substantially altered.



Please note that, under state law, need or over concentration of residential facilities constitutes the only legitimate grounds upon which the community can object.

Also under state law, if you do not forward a response within the forty-day period, the agency under the auspices of the Office of People With Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) will proceed with the development of the proposed facility.

We look forward to working closely and cooperatively with your community so that developmentally disabled persons can reside in a community setting. We would be pleased to meet with you at your convenience.
