These errors are reflected in the three Grade III infractions and the sentences longer than 30 days. These records have been corrected and the incorrect punitive segregation time was not served.

Note on methodology: It is common practice for multiple rule violations committed by an inmate on the same day to be handled at one hearing. Since 2012, all of the sentences to PS given for multiple rule violations at one hearing are served concurrently, so in practice it is only the longest sentence for the top charge heard at any one hearing that is served. That is what is reported here. In a very small number of instances, however, when an inmate commits more than one very serious rule violation due to separate incidents on the same day, two or more hearings may be held for these. In such cases, the 30 days in PS limit applies to each hearing. For this first reporting period, due to data limitations, for cases where 2 or more hearings are held for rule violations by one inmate on the same day, only the longest sentence to PS is reported here.
