Project Update - Spring 2013

Traffic and Transit Issues on 125th Street



- Heavy double parking throughout the corridor
- A lack of truck loading zones makes it difficult for delivery trucks to get to the curb
- Short bus stops lead to buses blocking traffic and being unable to safely load/unload passengers
- Buses are stopped over 60% of the time
- At 2.7 miles per hour, the M60 is slower than most people are able to walk

M60 SBS Traffic and Parking Improvements




Offset bus lanes

- Dedicated lane for buses and right-turning cars between Lenox Av and Second Av
- Parking/loading/bus stops remain at the curb
- New left-turn restrictions at Fifth Av and Lexington Av improve pedestrian safety and traffic flow




Changes to Parking Regulations

- Truck Loading zones in selected locations from 8 AM to 11 AM
- Conversion of Alternate-Side Parking to daytime Metered Parking east of Fifth Av
- Proposal to add residential parking on 124th and 126th Streets by converting some No Parking Zones to Alternate-Side Parking




Current Conditions



- Double parking and left turns lead to traffic and pedestrian safety concerns


Proposed Bus Lane Locations



- Bus lanes keep one lane clear for buses and right turns
- Curb regulations changes ease access to the curb
- Left turn restrictions keep through traffic moving and keep pedestrians safe

M60 SBS Transit Improvements

Limited Stops on the M60 in Manhattan and Queens



- M60 SBS stops at every subway/rail station on 125th St plus Amsterdam Av and Second Av
- Bus stops are unchanged on Bx15, M100, M101
- Bus stops will be lengthened to make it easier for buses to get to the curb

Off-Board Fare Payment



Speed your ride

1. Pay at on-street fare machines
2. Take your receipt
3. Board the bus through any of the three doors
