Chairman Fanuzzi called the meeting to order at 7:35 PM.

1. Public Gallery Session

- A. Cliff Stanton, PS 24 Parent Association, announced PS 24's participation in the first ever, community-wide Earth Day Walk to School Event on Friday, April 20, 2012. Additional information is available at www.walktoschool.org.

- B. Tracy Shelton announced that the Riverdale Festival of the Arts will be held on May 6th on Johnson Avenue, between West 235th and West 236th Street, from 11:00AM to 4:00PM. Flyers were left on the table.
- C. Julian Clayton, provided information on the Big Apple RX program. There is no age or income requirement, no expiration, no citizenship requirement, and a single card can be used for entire family or passed around to others.

2. Approval of Regular Board Meeting Minutes of March 13, 2012
- S. Alexander corrected the date of the Education Committee meeting to March 27th.
- The minutes were approved as corrected unanimously.
3. Discussion of Executive Board Committee Meeting Minutes of April 4, 2012
- The minutes were adopted as written.
4. Report from the Bronx Borough President's Office – C. McShane
- Borough President Ruben Diaz, Jr. is very pleased with NYC Economic Development Corporation's (NYCEDC) announcement of the selection of Equity One, Inc. to redevelop an 80,000 square foot site at West 230th Street and Broadway. The project is expected to create over 250 new jobs and 500 construction jobs. The development calls for four retail tenants. Equity One will purchase the site from the City for \$7.5 million. Construction is expected to start early 2013 and is expected to be completed within two years.
 - Bronx Borough President Ruben Diaz, Jr. and Mercy College in conjunction with Truman High School are please to announce the launch of The Bronx Achievement Pact, an innovative new educational initiative that aims to raise high school graduation rates, enhance college readiness and maximize college enrollment.
 - Bronx Borough President Ruben Diaz, Jr. submitted testimony to the City Council, Committee on Governmental Operations against proposed FY 2013 budget cuts to community board's budgets, which would have the effect of crippling these vital neighborhood institutions.
 - Bronx Week 2012 will commence May 10th through May 20th. Activities will include outdoor performances, trolley tours, health fairs, a salute to volunteers and business workshops, and much more. Valerie Capers, noted jazz musician and lifelong Bronxite will be honored on the Bronx Walk of Fame that will take place at the grand finale on May 20th. 5. Chairman invited Captain Burke to address the Board.

Captain Burke announced that the 50th Precinct ranked No. 1 in the Precincts' Coat Drive; police conducted a drug and weapons raid at Fort Independence House on the morning of April 6th and netted seven arrests from three different apartments; two 50th Precinct officers

were attacked on Easter Sunday by an emotionally disturbed male person who opened the door of the apartment for police and lunged with a knife. One officer was slashed across the face and received 15 stitches, and the other officer was slashed on the wrist.

6. Chairman invited Senator Rivera to address the Board.

Senator Rivera introduced and acknowledged the dedicated work of his staff members Josiris Urena who had been attending the board meetings as his representative and Maryann Rosa who would now be assigned to the Board. The Senator reviewed Legislative activity: the state budget was passed on time. However, he voted against a budget bill for housing due to the omission of funding for Tenant Protection Unit. Additionally, he voted against a bill that did not include health care change as required by President Obama's bill as the Governor has not created an Executive Order on the bills behalf. The Senator discussed the issue of related re-districting and the Democratic Caucus court challenge on the constitutionality of the creation of a 63rd district, the outcome will determine his district boundaries in Community Board 8. The Senator discussed the introduction of upcoming bills concerning smoking bans outside of schools and nutritional standards for children's Happy Meals. Upcoming events include an April 12th Town Hall meeting in the Senator's office sponsored by Transportations Alternatives on Access-A-Ride at 6:00PM; Senator Rivera's Housing Forum on the State of Affordable Housing at Lehman College, Music Building from 11:00AM to 3:00PM. M. Khury announced Senator Rivera scheduled appearance at Manhattan College on April 19th. M. Khury has flyers for event.

7. Chairman invited Assemblyman Dinowitz to address the Board.

Assemblyman Dinowitz advised that the perimeter sidewalk of Riverdale Kingsbridge Academy MS/HS 141 was rehabilitated in response to his complaint after someone tripped and fell. The Assemblyman commented on the state passing a balanced FY 2011 budget. This is the second time the state has passed a budget on time. He discussed the budget which included proceeds from a two year education budget passed last year resulting in additional funding for New York City Schools and that he spearheaded \$5 million restoration funds for tobacco prevention education. Unfortunately, he added that certain organizations such as Riverdale Mental Health Association and Kingsbridge Heights Community Center will not be funded for the third year in a row. With respect to redistricting, he is pleased regarding the Assembly district lines. The Assemblyman commented on the economic growth occurring all over the district, noting the Broadway Plaza, West 230th Street development which fits into the Broadway retail corridor.

8. Chairman invited Councilman Koppell to address the Board.

Councilman Koppell echoed the economic growth remarks made by Assemblyman Dinowitz. The Councilman discussed the city budget approval levels and advised that that Mayor's budget had no significant cuts, or layoffs. Council will negotiate the budget; the after-school program was significantly cut, as was libraries and cultural institutions. The Councilman felt positive that council will restore the Community Boards budget and is hearing testimony for funding from groups and organizations, i.e. Kingsbridge Heights Community Center and the Botanical Gardens. The Councilman discussed discretionary fund allocations including his allocation of \$1 million discretionary funds for construction at the Henry Ittleson Center, and discretionary funds for the Sid Augarten ballfield. Council also passed a prevailing wage bill and muni-meter five minute waiver.

9. Chairman's Report

- Chairman Fanuzzi thanked Councilman Koppell for his support of the Community Boards budget. He informed the board of his appearance before the City Council, Committee on Governmental Operations to give testimony opposing the FY 2013 budget cuts to the community boards. Chairman attended the recent groundbreaking for Van Cortlandt's Park Classic Playground basketball court. He also thanked Kingsbridge Heights Community Center for hosting the Community Board meeting and thanked Bob Bender for representing the Board at the Croton Filtration Monitoring Committee meeting.

10. Election of the Nominating Committee

Chairman Fanuzzi reviewed the guidelines and resolutions passed pertinent to the process of the election of the nominating committee and the duties of the Committee. He reminded the board that pursuant to the Bylaws, at the April Community Board Meeting, a nominating committee shall be elected by the board. Candidates for the nominating committee can be nominated from the floor by others; and can also nominate themselves.

BYLAWS: ARTICLE V, OFFICERS, SEC. 2 – At the regular meeting of the Board held in the month of April, a nominating committee consisting of not less than three (3) nor more than five (5) Appointed Members shall be elected by the Board. This committee shall designate its chairperson and shall present candidates for the offices to be filled at the election meeting. Additional candidates may be nominated from the floor at the election meeting. A majority of the Board members present and entitled to vote shall be required to elect a candidate to office. Should no candidate receive a majority on the first ballot, all of the candidates except those two receiving the largest number of votes shall be dropped from the ballot, and a second ballot shall take place.

STATEMENT OF GENERAL PRINCIPLES (from full board meeting minutes of May 8, 2001) – The Law Committee believes that it is impractical and inadvisable to establish specific qualifications, criteria, or quotas which would either limit Board Members in choosing a Nominating Committee, or limit the Nominating Committee in choosing a slate of Officers and Committee Chairs. Nevertheless, Board Members who are putting together a proposed slate, should make their choice, bearing in mind that it is both good policy as well as conducive to the smooth functioning of the Board to strive for a Nominating Committee and a slate of proposed Officers and Committee Chairs who represent diverse geographic areas within the Board, diverse communities, diverse ethnic and racial groups, and diverse professional and work backgrounds. The choices made should also consider the experience of any nominee as a Board Member and the extent of the interest shown by any such nominee in participating in Board matters. These factors, while not meant to impel any particular individual choice, should always serve as general guidance.

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Community Board to achieve a more democratic process and greater member participation in the nomination and selection of officers of the Community Board and chairpersons of its committees for the management of Community Board operations; and

WHEREAS, the governing Bylaws of the Community Board do not speak of procedures or provide guidelines for the Nominating Committee; and

WHEREAS, there is a need and opportunity for appropriate guidance to meet the current and future diverse interests of our community;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- (a) Officers: A member of the nominating committee may not be nominated by the committee for a position of officer; and
- (b) Committee Chairpersons: A member of the Nominating Committee under consideration for a committee chair shall recuse him/herself from discussion and vote for that position.
- (c) In the event of a tie vote in the Nominating Committee, both candidates for the position shall be presented to the board; and
- (d) Report of the Nominating Committee: The Nominating Committee shall complete its activities and present its slates to the full Community Board at least two calendar weeks before the June meeting, at which time the election will take place.
