 Remember to Renew Your Senior Citizen Homeowners' Exemption (SCHE) and Disabled Homeowners' Exemption (DHE)

If you currently receive the Senior Citizen Homeowner Exemption (SCHE) or Disability Homeowner Exemption (DHE), you may need to file your renewal application by March 15, 2017. SCHE participants renew every two (2) years. DHE participants renew annually. In October, the NYC Department of Finance mailed renewal applications to current participants. The Department of Finance sent the application early to allow participants ample time to prepare the renewal application and to gather all of the required documents. If you misplaced the SCHE/DHE renewal application, please email recertify@finance.nyc.gov, or you can call 311 to request another application. If the application is mailed, please allow 7-10 business days for the copy to arrive. For more information visit the NYC Department of Finance website by clicking here.



• Department of Sanitation "Night Plow" Operations

Every year, the Department of Sanitation (DSNY) engages in seasonal "Night Plow" operations, which run through mid-April, to ensure each Sanitation District is properly staffed 24/7 in case of a snow/winter storm emergency. The seasonal winter operation schedule assures that DSNY will have a sufficient number of employees assigned and available around the clock to operate essential snow fighting equipment in each of the city's 59 Sanitation Districts. During Night Plow, some resident's normal trash and recycling collection times may change temporarily, as workers in each district are assigned to the 4:00PM to midnight and midnight to 8:00AM shifts, in addition to the regular daytime shift. To ensure pickup, put items out for collection between 4:00PM and midnight the evening before your scheduled collection day. For more information, click here.

In addition, Borough President Diaz is encouraging young people ages 16 and 17 to apply for community board membership. Last year, the borough president appointed five young people to the community boards, and is working to insure that there is a least one youth member per community board.

NYC Needs Emergency Snow Laborers

The Department of Sanitation (DSNY) and The Department of Transportation (DOT) are accepting registrations for emergency snow laborers for this snow season. Snow laborers are Per-diem workers who are called upon to remove snow and ice citywide from bus stops, crosswalks, fire hydrants and step streets in the City after heavy snowfalls.

Individuals interested in registering with the DSNY can do so at their local district garage weekdays between 7:00AM and 3:00PM. The list of garage locations can be found at www.nyc.gov/sanitation. Individuals interested in registering with DOT please visit the Bronx Yard at Mosholu Avenue and Broadway (Van Cortlandt Park) and bring with them two small photos (1 ¹/₂ Square), original and copy of two forms of identification and social security card.

Laborers will be paid \$15.00 per hour, and \$22.50 per hour after 40 hours are worked in a week. Snow laborers must be at least 18 years of age, be eligible to work in the United States, and able to perform heavy physical labor.

1. Family Art Project: Coyote and Owl Fixtures and Tricksters

2. Owl Pellet Dissection

3. Nature Talk: Coyotes in the Big Apple

Coyotes have become residents of the wilder areas of New York City. Find out where our local coyotes live, what they eat, and how they coexist with humans in one of the most densely-populated areas of the country. Children ages 12 and older welcome with an adult. 4. Coyote Info Station

Coyotes have lived with New Yorkers for longer than you may think. Environmental Educators explain the history of coyotes in New York City and suggest tips for living peacefully with these wild neighbors. This event is taking place on Saturday, February 4 from 11:00AM to 2:00PM.
