Meeting opened by Vice Chair, Anthony P. Creaney.

Minutes approved for last meeting.

Captain Kevin Burke took command on June 1, 2011. There is a 4% increase in crime; burglary and grand larceny on the rise. A marble hill resident committed 6 robbery's and is in Riker's Island. Robberies have increased in buildings without a doorman because of easier access to the building. Robberies have also been committed with entry to the apartments from the fire escape. Windows should be secured.

The committee approved all renewal liquor license applications before it and they will be presented to the full Board in October:

- Land & Sea Restaurant – 5535 Broadway
- KBBQ Corporation

The committee discussed that establishments serving alcohol should be required to have an electronic I.D. checker.

The Department of Buildings ordered a vacate order at 3835 Bailey Avenue for an illegal conversion. This single family home was illegally divided into 10 separate units.

The NYPD has a safety brochure with tips and recommendations.

Residents living in the proximity of the Riverdale Garden, 4582 Manhattan College Parkway reported that there are high levels of noise from both people and music until the early morning hours. The establishment operates until midnight during the week and 2AM on the weekends.

Other complaints involving Manhattan College students creating loud noise is in a building at 3636 Greystone Avenue and also in the vicinity of West 238th Street and Greystone Avenue.
