BRONX COMMUNITY BOARD 8 IS OPERATION BACKPACK 2014 DROP SITE!

Bronx, New York - Join Bronx Community Board No. 8 and Volunteers of America-Greater New York in launching **OPERATION BACKPACK 2014**, to support homeless children.

Volunteers of America-Greater New York has an annual drive to collect brand new backpacks and new school supplies for the thousands of children living in New York City shelters. The Board office, located at 5676 Riverdale Avenue, Suite 100, will be a **DROP SITE** for backpacks from 9:30PM to 4:30PM daily. **The campaign kicks off on Monday, July 14th and the Board office will accept backpacks through July 31st.**

Additionally, in a continuing partnership with Volunteers of America-Greater New York, every Duane Reade location will be accepting donations of new backpacks and school supplies from the public. Dozens of companies, schools, community groups, and religious institutions will also host collection drives.

Thousands of children live in NYC's homeless and domestic violence shelters and Rachel Weinstein, Vice-President/Chief Development and Communications Officer of Volunteers of America-Greater New York, speaks of the importance of the program. "We need to equip children with all the tools to allow them to succeed in school, because a high school diploma is essential to breaking the cycle of homelessness. **Operation Backpack** is vital because a new backpack and supplies can be the difference between a child being excited to go to school and refusing to go. And with the average cost of a filled backpack hovering around \$81, we can relieve the financial burden that many parents face when making decisions for their families."

This year's goal is to collect 16,500 backpacks!

The public is urged to drop new backpacks and school supplies at Bronx Community Board #8 offices located at 5676 Riverdale Avenue, Suite 100, Bronx, New York, 10471 or at any Duane Reade in New York City from July 14th to August 8th.
