Job Description

The New York City Conflicts of Interest Board is seeking a Deputy General Counsel. The Deputy General Counsel reports to the General Counsel. With the General Counsel, the Deputy General Counsel will be responsible for performing the advice-giving work of the agency, that is, for assisting the Board in fulfilling its City Charter mandate of providing advice to current and former public servants, as well as lobbyists, regarding compliance with the City's conflicts of interest law and lobbyist gift law. The successful candidate will independently handle an extensive caseload of advice matters; review and assign incoming matters in the absence of the General Counsel; conduct legal research and analysis; draft advisory opinions, staff letters, and memoranda to the Board; provide oral advice to City employees; serve as point of contact for the ethics liaisons at City agencies; conduct training sessions; and with the General Counsel supervise the other attorneys in the Board's Legal Advice Unit in performing these functions.

Minimum Qualification Requirements

Admission to the New York State Bar; and four years of recent full-time responsible, relevant, satisfactory legal experience subsequent to admission to any bar, eighteen months of which must have been in the supervision of other attorneys, in an administrative, managerial or executive capacity, or performing highly complex and significant legal work.

Incumbents must remain Members of the New York State Bar in good standing for the duration of this employment.

Preferred Skills

The successful candidate must possess the maturity, discretion, and judgment necessary for the handling of a myriad of sensitive, and often confidential, matters, and the advising of public servants at all levels, including senior elected and appointed officials, as well as the organizational skills to handle the demands of a high volume legal practice. Strong writing and analytical skills are required, as is a temperament suitable to work in and help lead a small, collegial law office. Prior government experience is also preferred.

Residency Requirement

New York City residency is generally required within 90 days of appointment.
