'Cinderella'

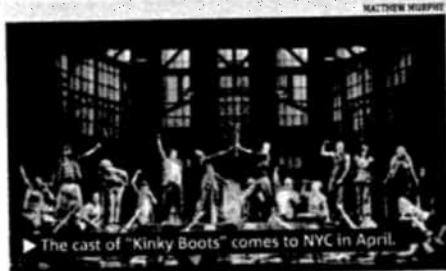

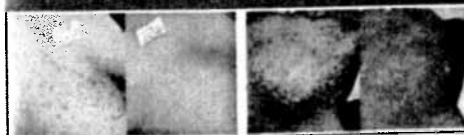

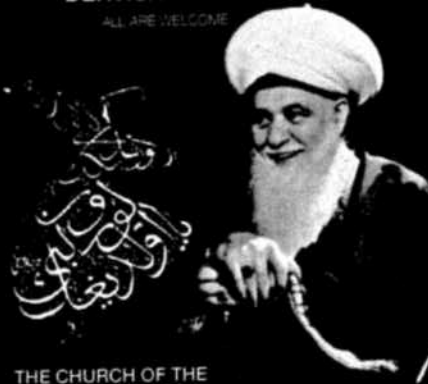

With his own wife now dead, Herman is challenged to believe in his much-lauded romantic advice when he sets out to help out Eli and Emily, a couple living in Carroll Gardens. Schrank seamlessly weaves together this tale of a struggling marriage with the complexities of book publishing, interspersing the love story with press releases, correspondence between publishing house employees, and excerpts from Herman's book.

The *Brooklyn Eagle* spoke to Schrank about his Brooklyn connections; he recalls his upbringing in Park Slope and shares with us his thoughts on living amongst a slew of talented writers.

EAGLE: Why did you decide to focus your novel on Brooklynites?

I believed that the winner of the "Marriage is a Canoe" contest in my novel would be someone who recently moved to Brooklyn. I wanted those characters and that part of my novel to be very true to

I'm not sure how Brooklyn has informed my writing save that I'm wildly aware of all the great writers within shouting distance. I had no idea that by staying put in my hometown, I'd soon be surrounded by thousands of other, better writers. I sometimes feel that I can only be competitive about my writing space—I have an over-sized bulkhead room on my roof with views of Manhattan. I tell myself that, though I may not be the best writer living in Brooklyn, I definitely have the best writer's room in Brooklyn.

EAGLE: How do you balance your writing career with your job as a publisher?

I wake up really early and write and then go to Manhattan and spend the rest of the day working on other people's novels. I haven't found a balance yet, but I love writing and I love my job, so I don't mind working hard at both of them.

Schrank is the president and publisher of a Penguin imprint, Razorbill, and has previously published two novels, "Consent" and "Miracle Man." Schrank has also worked as a columnist for Seventeen magazine. He will be appearing at BookCourt on January 10 for a reading, audience Q&A, and signing. 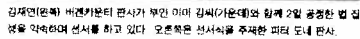

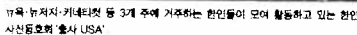

ПРЕДСТАВИТЕЛЬ МИД ИЗРАИЛЯ: В 2013 ГОДУ ПРОИЗОЙДЕТ СМЕНА ПОСЛА В ТАШКЕНТЕ

Отношения с Узбекистаном, которые в последние годы были довольно прохладными, улучшаются.

Как сообщает новостное агентство 12news.uz, об этом в интервью порталу IzRue заявила директор Департамента Центральной Европы и Евразии МИД Анна Азари, курирующая, в том числе, связи Израиля с республиками СНГ.

По ее словам, министерства иностранных дел ведут постоянный диалог. «В 2013 году произойдет смена посла в Ташкенте», — отметила Анна Азари.

Напомним, что в настоящее время главой израильского диппредставительства в нашей стране является Хилель Ньюман.

Ранее сообщалось, что 16 октября 2012 года в МИД Узбекистана состоялась встреча с израильской делегацией во главе с заместителем генерального директора Министерства иностранных дел Анной Азари. По данным МИД республики, на встрече были обсуждены практические аспекты двусторонних отношений. Отмечено, что перспективными направлениями узбекско-израильского взаимодействия являются торгово-экономические связи, привлечение передовых технологий в сельское хозяйство, водосбережение, энергетику и другие сферы. Стороны об-



менялись мнениями по вопросам культурно-гуманитарных контактов, а также актуальным международным и региональным проблемам.

По официальным данным, Израиль в декабре 1991 года признал независимость Узбекистана в Тель-Авиве. В мае 1992 года было открыто Посольство Израиля в Ташкенте. КАНАЛ JN1 ПОДВОДИТ ИТОГИ 2012 ГОДА

Сирены в городе зазвучали впервые с 1991 года, со времен войны в Персидском заливе. ХАМАС начал ракетные обстрелы территорий Израиля, а в ответ ЦАХАЛ провел спецоперацию под кодовым названием «Облачный столп», целью которой была защита мирных граждан страны от огня боевиков ХАМАС. За год, в общей сложности, по территории Израиля были выпущены 2 200 снарядов. У премьер-министра Биньямина Нетаньягу не оставалось другого выхода, кроме как ответить проведением 8-дневной военной операции, направленной против боевиков из сектора Газа. Это стало важнейшим событием уходящего года для всех израильтян.

Политическая обстановка в соседних странах также изменилась. В Египте, впервые в истории страны, президентом был избран Мохаммед Мурси. Он является представителем движения «Братья-мусульмане», деятельность которого ранее была запрещена Хосни Мубарак, свергнутым в результате революции, произошедшей в этой стране.

А за океаном, в США Барак Обама вновь был избран президентом страны. Этот пост он будет занимать ближайшие 4 года. В напряженной президентской гонке он победил республиканца Митта Ромни. Оба кандидата активно боролись за голоса еврейских избирателей.

На международной арене в ноябре в ООН прошло голосование, по результатам которого Палестинская автономия по-

лучила статус государства-наблюдателя, не члена ООН. Власти США и Израиля не поддержали это решение, заявив, что оно не будет способствовать восстановлению мирного процесса в регионе.

Этот год выдался непростым для представителей еврейской общины в разных странах мира. В июле внимание мировой общественности было приковано к теракту в болгарском городе Бургас. Террорист-смертник подорвал автобус с еврейскими туристами. В теракте погибли пятеро израильтян, и 30 туристов получили ранения. Израиль обвинил «Хезболлу» в организации нападения.

В марте во французском городе Тулузе радикальный исламист Мохаммед Мерах устроил стрельбу в еврейской школе, убив троих детей и раввина.

На Jewish News One, первом в мире еврейском новостном канале, 2012 год стал годом развития и расширения. JN1 начал вещание на арабском, французском и испанском языках. На сегодня количество доступных языков вещания достигло шести. В первом полугодии канал также запустил приложения для iPhone и Android.

ing debt ratios, are already in the range of 16 percent to 42 percent of total revenues.

In addition, it says that high amortization exposes some countries to "considerable rollover risk that could trigger a fiscal crisis."

The paper says that structural fiscal problems have resulted in a "sizable accumulation of debt," stating that between 1997 and 2004, the average debt to GDP ratio in the region increased from 54 percent to 84 percent, "driven mainly by deteriorating primary balances."

It says that successive years of fiscal deficit, public enterprise borrowing and off balance sheet spending, including financial sector bailouts, "all contributed to high debt levels."

It notes that prior to the onset of the global crisis, moderate growth rates helped some countries to broadly stabilize and reduce their debt ratios, albeit at high levels.

The working paper points

and subsequent slow recovery in advanced countries had a "significant adverse effect undermining growth in the largely tourism-dependent Caribbean, exposing balance sheet vulnerabilities built up over many years."

The working paper says these vulnerabilities originated from a strategy of increasing public spending to counteract declining trade performance, partly due to the erosion of trade preferences, and rebuilding costs after frequent natural disasters.

As a result, the working paper says the ratio of public debt to GDP increased by about 15 percentage points between 2008 and 2010.

By contrast, it says that Caribbean commodity exporters rebounded rapidly after the crisis, buoyed by high commodity prices, stating that their debt ratios have stabilized at "relatively low."

The working paper says several countries have made attempts at reducing debt, mainly through "ad hoc restructuring or fiscal con-

solidation."

But it says since most countries have not adopted comprehensive economic reforms to complement these adjustment efforts, "the initial gains have not been sustained."

Further, because of their middle income status, the paper says the majority of regional countries have not been able to benefit from international debt relief.

Moreover, it says only a few Caribbean countries still qualify for concessional borrowing at the World Bank.

At the same time, the IMF working paper says the region's small size and geographical location makes it "highly vulnerable to a host of frequent shocks, against which it is costly to insure."

"As a result, Caribbean economies have had a silent debt crisis for the past two decades, contributing to a high debt-low growth trap," it says.

Based on a survey of country experiences, the working paper says fiscal consolidation based on expenditure reductions "tend to be more effective than tax based consolidations."

However, it says for countries with large adjustment needs, fiscal consolidation may need to be a balanced combination of spending cuts and revenue increases.

The working paper says better control of the public wage bill, increasing public sector efficiency and tackling transfer spending are "obvious targets to reduce spending."

On the revenue side, it says there is "significant potential" for reducing tax expenditure, eliminating distortions and broadening the tax base."

It says fiscal consolidation needs to be complemented by a comprehensive strategy to reduce public debt, including tax policy reforms, improving the efficiency of government spending, containing contingent liabilities, public sector rationalization, active debt management and debt restructuring, and growth enhancing structural reforms.

The IMF working paper says Caribbean countries can draw lessons from successful fiscal consolidation efforts in other regions to guide their fiscal consolidation efforts.

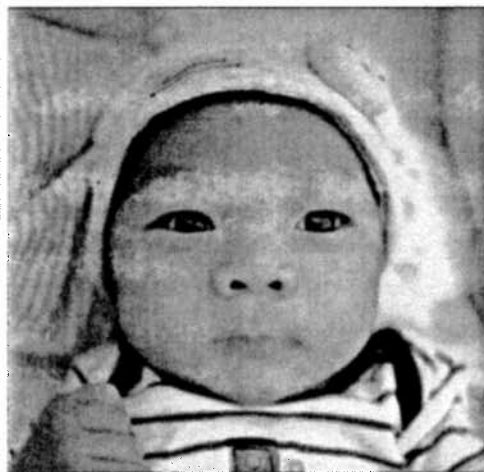

said EPA regional administrator Walter Muggins.

Superfund rules require the city to take some form of action — and building and maintaining the underground tunnels on city-owned land near the canal is far cheaper than reworking the neighborhood's sewers to keep overflows out of the canal when rains flood the system.

The idea suggests catch basins at the two outfall sites that currently spew most of the harmful runoff into the waterway. The proposed basins will hold up to eight million gallons of runoff until storm pass, then push the slop back through sewers to the Red Hook and Coney Island wastewater treatment plants — reducing raw sewage discharges into the canal by an estimated 58 to 74 percent.

Officials say sewage isn't the primary form of pollution in the canal, but dredging the foul mud from the bottom of the waterway will serve little use if runoff recontaminates it every time it rains.

"The [combined sewage overflows] are not the dominant source of toxic pollution at this point, but they are an important source of it and the importance of that source will increase when the other sources are cut off," Muggins said. "[It] needs to be controlled in order to get the full cleanup."

Neighborhood activists expressed the Superfund cleanup to focus exclusively on the toxic canal-bed, and they are furious the city will target the discharge, and the nasty stench that comes with it.

"We have been trying to get the city to do something about the [sewer] pollution for years," said Linda Mariano, co-chair of Friends and Residents of the Greater Gowanus.

"It's very good that they are going to make the effort. That's what we have been waiting for, for all of these years. I'm happy."

The details of the plan are not yet set in stone — the city will finalize the proposal within the next year after a 90-day public comment period including two eagerly anticipated community meetings on Jan. 23 and Jan. 24.

For now, the city says it will do what it has to do to clean up the canal.

"We look forward to carefully reviewing the details of the EPA's proposal and working with our state and federal partners to improve water quality and support the cleanup of the canal," said the city's Department of Environmental Protection in a statement.

Along with the city, the city has supported three-dot contributors to foot the bill for the cleanup, which is expected to cost between \$48 million to \$500 million, including the energy giant National Grid, formerly the Brooklyn Union Gas Company, Con Edison, and Verizon.

The worst contamination of the 18-year-old Gowanus Canal comes from its past as a major industrial transportation route for manufactured gas plants, paper mills, breweries, and other chemical plants that operated along its banks, agency officials said.

From the 1950s to the late 1970s, the waterway fueled the nation's growth into an industrial power — but in the process, generated a byproduct called coal tar that contained an array of hazardous compounds and has seeped 150 feet down below the canal.

The state's Department of Environmental Conservation will oversee the cleanup of polluted plots of land where three gas plants once stood along the canal and will hold responsible National Grid, the company that inherited legal liability.

The Superfund cleanup proposal also calls for:

• Blocking of any illegal hookups into the city's sewer system that pollutes that canal.

• Seven options for dredging the waterway.

• Seven options for treating and disposing of the foul sludge scraped up from the canal-bed, either on-site or out of Brooklyn, where it will be burned, turned into fuel, or

used as landfill.

• Supplementary techniques to keep sewer water out of the canal including street-level plantings and water-retaining green spaces, funded by federal and city grants.

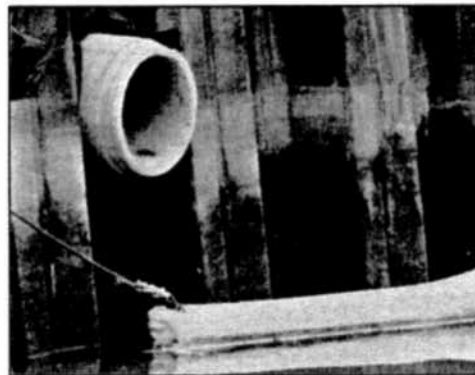

the details of the EPA's proposal and working with our state and federal partners to improve water quality and support the cleanup of the canal," said the city's Department of Environmental Protection in a statement.

Along with the city, the feds have tapped three-dozen polluters to foot the bill for the cleanup, which is expected to cost between \$467 million to \$504-million, including the energy giant National Grid, formerly the Brooklyn Union Gas company, Con Edison, and Verizon.

The worst contamination of the 150-year-old Gowanus Canal comes from its past as a major industrial transportation route for manufactured gas plants, paper mills, tanneries, and other chemical plants that operated along its banks, agency officials said.

From the 1860s to the late 1950s, the waterway fueled the nation's growth into an industrial power — but in the process, generated a byproduct called coal tar that contains

an array of hazardous compounds and has seeped 150 feet down below the canal.

The state's Department of Environmental Conservation will oversee the cleanup of polluted plots of land where three gas plants once stood along the canal and will hold responsible National Grid, the company that inherited legal liability.

The Superfund cleanup proposal also calls for:

- Blocking of any illegal hookup into the city's sewer system that pollutes that canal.

- Seven options for dredging the waterway.

- Seven options for treating and disposing of the foul gunk scraped up from the canal-bed, either on-site or out of Brooklyn, where it will be burned, turned into fuel, or used as landfill.

- Supplementary techniques to keep sewer water out of the canal including street-level plantings and water-retaining green spaces, funded by federal and city grants.

Federal officials say that the three-dozen po-

tentially responsible parties will have the option to choose how exactly to dispose of the toxic waste under the oversight of the EPA — but no matter what they choose they will cover the costs.

After the plan is finalized, there will be an estimated two-year design phase and the actual cleanup will go on until about 2020, agency officials said.

Gerritsen Beach, but also other parts of the city such as the Far Rockaways and Manhattan.

"We weren't asking them to go into Superfund sites," said Fitzgerald. "Just to collect what they would come in contact with anyway."

The unconventional, open-sourced approach to scientific inquiry forces the researchers to sacrifice some control of the experiment — but it helps them take in a large quantity of samples with little time in the field.

"I teach classes, so I can't run all over getting samples," said Keimowitz.

"Right now, we don't have the time."

The researchers have already been inundated with samples from scientists — both amateur and professional — as well as from concerned locavores.

"We got samples from a lot of people involved in community gardening who wanted to know what was in the food they were growing," said Fitzgerald.

Gowanus resident Ey-mund Deigel said mailing soil to the upstate scientists will help all Brooklynites gain real understanding about the storm of the century.

"More data means better information and better discussion," said Deigel. "There's a lot of paranoia and a lot of people saying nothing happened. The more we know, the more we can actually get things done."
