WHAT THE JOB INVOLVES: Stationary Engineers, under supervision, operate, maintain and adjust steam power plant and electro-mechanical building equipment. They operate, maintain and adjust boilers, furnaces, engines, pumps, heat exchangers, generators, motors, chillers, cooling towers, equipment for heating, ventilating, air conditioning, lighting and associated equipment in public buildings, municipal pumping stations and incinerators; make periodic inspections of equipment and minor repairs to such equipment; perform preventive maintenance; take responsible charge of a watch, and while so engaged are responsible for and direct subordinate personnel; may operate control consoles in control rooms; prepare requisitions for materials and spare parts; instruct and train subordinates and other personnel; read meters, gauges, and other recording devices and log the data; keep records and write reports; as directed, inspect low pressure boilers in accordance with a unified inspection procedure instituted by the New York City Department of Buildings; and may operate a motor vehicle. All Stationary Engineers perform related work.

Some of the physical activities performed by Stationary Engineers and environmental conditions experienced are: working in confined areas in a physical plant, including the boiler room, heating and ventilating room; walking up and down stairs; climbing up and down ladders; handling chemicals; and being around hazardous materials, such as asbestos and infectious waste.

Special Working Conditions: Stationary Engineers may be required to work shifts including nights, Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.

(This is a brief description of what you might do in this position and does not include all the duties of this position.)

THE SALARY: The current minimum salary is \$49.21 per hour, for a 40 hour work week. This rate is subject to change.

HOW TO APPLY: If you believe you are eligible to take this examination submit an application on the Online Application System (OASys) at www.nyc.gov/examsforjobs. Follow the onscreen application instructions for electronically submitting your application and payment, and completing any required information. A valid email address is required to file online. Several internet service providers, including but not limited to Google, Yahoo!, Hotmail, and AOL, offer free email addresses. The following methods of payment are acceptable: major credit card, bank card associated with a bank account, or a prepaid debit card with a credit card logo which you may purchase online or at various retail outlets. You may come to the DCAS Computer-based Testing & Applications Centers to file for this examination online and submit a money order payable to DCAS (Exams).

Special Circumstances Guide: This guide is located on the DCAS website at www.nyc.gov/html/dcas/downloads/pdf/misc/exam_special_circumstances.pdf and available at the DCAS Computer-based Testing & Applications Centers. This guide gives important information about claiming Veterans' or Legacy credit, and notifying DCAS of a change in your mailing address. Follow all instructions on the Special Circumstances Guide that pertain to you when you complete your "Application for Examination."

READ CAREFULLY AND SAVE FOR FUTURE REFERENCE

ELIGIBILITY TO TAKE EXAMINATION: This examination is open to each employee of an agency under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner, Department of Citywide Administrative Services, who **on the last day of the application period:**

- (1) holds a permanent (not provisional) competitive appointment or appears on a Preferred List (see Note, below) for the title of Oiler or High Pressure Plant Tender; and
- (2) is not otherwise ineligible.

(Note: A "Preferred List" is a civil service list which is only for certain former permanent incumbents in the eligible title who have rehiring rights.)

This examination is also open to employees who were appointed to an eligible title pursuant to New York State Civil Service Law, section 55-a, and who meet all other eligibility requirements.

If you do not know if you are eligible, check with your **agency's personnel office**. You are responsible for determining whether or not you meet the eligibility requirements for this examination prior to submitting your application. If you are marked " Not Eligible," your application fee will not be refunded and you will not receive a score.

License Requirement: By the last day of the application period, you must possess a valid license for High Pressure Boiler Operating Engineer issued by the New York City Department of Buildings.

You must complete all parts of Section C of the Education and Experience Test, giving all required information on this license in order to be eligible. This license must be maintained for the duration of your employment.

For certain agencies, you will be required, within 90 days from the day of promotion, to obtain a valid certificate of fitness for Standpipe, Automatic Sprinkler and/or Air Compressor, issued by the New York City Fire Department.

For the Department of Sanitation and the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene(DOHMH) only: At the time of promotion, you must have:

1. A motor vehicle driver license valid in the State of New York. If you have a moving violation, license suspension or an accident record, you may be disqualified. This license must be maintained for the duration of your employment;
2. A valid Refrigerating System Operating Engineer Certificate issued by the NYC Fire Department; and
3. A valid Universal Chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) Certificate issued by the United States Environmental Protection Agency.

For the NYC Transit Authority only: At the time of promotion, you must have a motor vehicle driver license valid in the State of New York. If you have a moving violation, license suspension or an accident record, you may be disqualified. This license must be maintained for the duration of your employment.

You must clearly specify in detail your relevant license on your Education and Experience Test and submit it by the end of the application period. You will not receive credit for a license which you obtain after the application period, nor will you be permitted to submit new or additional information about your license once the application period has ended.

ELIGIBILITY TO BE PROMOTED: In order to be eligible for promotion, you must have completed your probationary period in an eligible title as indicated in the above "Eligibility To Take Examination" section, and you must be permanently employed in an eligible title or your name must appear on a Preferred List for the eligible title at the time of promotion. Additionally, you must have served permanently in an eligible title for at least one year.

REQUIRED INFORMATION:

1. **Application for Examination:** Follow the online instructions, including those relating to the payment of fee and, if applicable, those found in the Special Circumstances Guide.
2. **Education and Experience Test:** Fill out **section B to indicate your experience, section C to indicate your possession of a High Pressure Boiler Operating Engineer License, and section D (if applicable) to indicate your interest in Selective Certification**. This test must be filled out completely and in detail for you to receive your proper rating. Follow the online instructions.

THE TEST: You will be given a license and experience test. Your score on this test will be used to determine your place on an eligible list. You will receive a score of 70 points for meeting the eligibility and license requirement listed above. After this requirement is met, you will receive additional credit up to a maximum of 100 points on the following basis:

If you have satisfactory full-time experience operating a high pressure boiler **while in possession of** a valid license for High Pressure Boiler Operating Engineer issued by the the New York City Department of Buildings for:

	You will Receive:
At least 1 year, but less than 2 years	10 points
At least 2 years, but less than 5 years	20 points
5 or more years	30 points

You will receive a maximum of one year of experience credit for each year you worked. If you have any of the above experience on a part-time basis, it will be credited according to the equivalent percent of full-time experience.

You must clearly specify in detail all of your relevant experience on your Education and Experience Test and submit it by the end of the application period. You will not receive credit for experience which you obtain after the end of the application period, nor will you be permitted to submit new or additional information about your experience once the application period has ended.

Experience must be obtained by **the last day of the application period.**

THE TEST RESULTS: If you pass the license and experience test and are marked eligible your name will be placed in final score order on an eligible list and you will be given a list number. You will be notified by mail of your test results. If you meet all requirements and conditions, you will be considered for promotion when your name is reached on the eligible list.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Selective Certification for positions requiring a Certificate of Equivalent Instructions and/or a Restricted Asbestos Investigator Certificate issued by the New York City Department of Environmental Protection: If you have a Certificate of Equivalent Instructions and/or a Restricted Asbestos Investigator Certificate issued by the New York City Department of Environmental Protection, you may be considered for promotion to positions requiring this certificate through a process called Selective Certification. If you qualify for Selective Certification, you may be given preferred consideration for positions requiring this certificate. If you wish to apply for this Selective Certification, state “**RAI**” in Section D of the Education and Experience Test. Your Certificate will be checked by the promoting agency at the time of promotion. If you are promoted through this selective certification **this certificate must be maintained for the duration of your employment.**

Selective Certification for positions requiring a Certificate of Qualification for Refrigerating System Operating Engineer issued by the New York City Fire Department: If you have a Certificate of Qualification for Refrigerating System Operating Engineer you may be considered for promotion to positions requiring this certificate through a process called Selective Certification. If you qualify for Selective Certification, you may be given preferred consideration for positions requiring this certificate. If you wish to apply for this Selective Certification, state “**RMO**” in Section D of the Education and Experience Test. Your Certificate will be checked by the promoting agency at the time of promotion. If you are promoted through this selective certification **this certificate must be maintained for the duration of your employment.**

Selective Certification for positions requiring a Certificate of Hazardous Materials issued by an OSHA-approved program: If you have a Certificate of Hazardous Materials issued by an OSHA-approved program you may be considered for promotion to positions requiring this certificate through a process called Selective Certification. If you qualify for Selective Certification, you may be given preferred consideration for positions requiring this certificate. If you wish to apply for this Selective Certification, state “**HME**” in Section D of the Education and Experience Test. Your Certificate will be checked by the promoting agency at the time of promotion. If you are promoted through this selective certification **this certificate must be maintained for the duration of your employment.**

Selective Certification for positions requiring a Universal Chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) Certificate for Handling Refrigerants issued by the United States Environmental Protection Agency: If you have a Universal Chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) Certificate for Handling Refrigerants issued by the United States Environmental Protection Agency you may be considered for, promotion to positions requiring this certificate through a process called Selective Certification. If you qualify for Selective Certification, you may be given preferred consideration for positions requiring this certificate. If you wish to apply for this Selective Certification, state “**CFC**” in Section D of the Education and Experience Test. Your Certificate will be checked by the promoting agency at the time of promotion. If you are promoted through this selective certification **this certificate must be maintained for the duration of your employment.**

The above Selective Certification requirements may be met at anytime during the duration of the list. If you meet any of these requirements at some future date, please submit a request by mail to: DCAS Bureau of Examinations - TEEG, 1 Centre Street, 14th Floor, New York, NY 10007. Please include the examination title and number and your social security number and the Selective Certification you are requesting on your correspondence.

Application Receipt: You will be emailed a receipt immediately after you have applied for the examination. If you do not receive this receipt, contact this agency at OASys@dcas.nyc.gov. Include your social security number and the examination number and title in your email. You will also be mailed an acknowledgment letter within three months of the last date of the application period. If you do not receive an acknowledgment letter, write to this agency, Attention: Exam Support Group, 1 Centre Street, 14th Floor, New York, NY 10007 to request verification that your application was received. Include your social security number and the examination number and title in your request.

PENALTY FOR MISREPRESENTATION: Any intentional misrepresentation on the application or examination may result in disqualification, even after promotion, and may result in criminal prosecution.

The General Examination Regulations of the Department of Citywide Administrative Services apply to this examination and are part of this Notice of Examination. They are posted and copies are available at NYC.gov and at the DCAS Computer-based Testing and Application Centers.
