Permits and approvals required for the construction and operation of the Croton Water Treatment Plant (WTP) within New York City include permits from the New York City

Department of Parks and Recreation for work in the vicinity of the Jerome Park Reservoir and Van Cortlandt Park. Approvals from the New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission are also required for work in the vicinity of the Jerome Parke Reservoir.

The City will secure all applicable approvals necessary. The applicability of New York City Zoning Resolution Section 11-13 is still under consideration. All permits and approvals considered to be potentially required and the rationale for them will be made public.

In addition to the discretionary approvals listed above, the proposed project must undergo an environmental review in accordance with the New York State Environmentally Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and the New York City Environmental Quality Review (CEQR) process, as well as several other agency reviews, including reviews under the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) of 1966 and the New York State Historic Preservation Act (SHPA) of 1980.
