Section 4.2 Land Acquisition Program of the Revised 2007 FAD requires DEP to “execute a contract with the WAC, the intent of which is for the City to continue, through 2034, to pay the stewardship and enforcement costs associated with the WAC’s current and future portfolio of conservation easements...” The City has successfully negotiated this contract with WAC. The contract is in the City’s administrative processing phase and is expected to be registered by October of 2015. In the meantime, stewardship and enforcement costs associated with the WAC’s current and future portfolio of City-funded conservation easements are fully funded under DEP’s existing contract with WAC.
