With this letter, I am submitting the following deliverables, due November 30, 2013, pursuant to EPA's July 2007 Filtration Avoidance Determination (FAD) and the Draft Revised FAD:

<i>Program</i>	<i>Deliverable</i>
<i>4.6 Stream Management Program</i>	Propose a plan and schedule for providing routine, systematic training in stream, floodplain, and watershed management techniques targeted to local officials. Training shall include information on best maintenance practices for roadside ditches.

In addition, Section 9 of the Draft Revised FAD requires DEP, in consultation with the New York City Office of Management and Budget, to make a presentation to NYSDOH/EPA and NYSDEC on the amount of money appropriated and spent for watershed protection programs and its adequacy to meet program objectives and FAD requirements. The presentation was given on November 21, 2013.
