Project Updates

- Section 4.9 East of Hudson Non-point Source Pollution Control Program, Stormwater Projects, deliverable requirement: Stormwater Remediation Projects: BC-1, WB-1, WB-2, CF-1, CR-1.

The projects were separated into two contracts. The contract for three projects on non-City owned property was awarded in September of 2012 and construction began in October of 2012. These include the projects at Nemarest Club, Sycamore Park and Michael Brook. The two projects on City owned land, Drewville Road in Carmel and Maple Avenue in Bedford, are in design.

- Section 4.10 Kensico Water Quality Control Program, Kensico Action Plan, deliverable requirement: Complete construction of selected practices.


There are four construction practices incorporated in this deliverable. The Wipoorwill Stream Rehabilitation and N1 Lake Drive Drainage Improvements are substantially completed. The remaining two practices are expected to be completed by October of 2013.

In the 2011 Long-Term Watershed Protection Plan, under the Wetlands Protection Program, DEP proposed the following Activity/Milestone: Update

Wetlands Protection Strategy to reflect programmatic changes. The proposed due date was December 31, 2012. While the 2011 Plan has not yet been incorporated into a FAD update, DEP proceeded with an update to the Wetlands Protection Strategy, and copy is attached.
