DJJ Moves to Permanent Headquarters at 110 William Street

On Tuesday, January 22, 2008 the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) opened the doors to its new headquarters facility on the 13th and 14th Floor of 110 William Street in Lower Manhattan.

The new office space is characterized by an open "bullpen" style setting in which staff can freely interact, consistent with the style of the Bloomberg Administration. This setting improves the delivery of agency services and enhances customer service to staff and all New Yorkers who interact with DJJ.

Deputy Commissioner for Administration & Policy Jacqueline James said of the new headquarters: "It is an exciting and proud time for our Agency as we begin a new era in our permanent space"

DJJ Headquarters houses the administrative, executive and operations staff of the Agency and provides support to the Department's three secure detention facilities and eighteen non-secure detention facilities throughout the five boroughs.

The new office space was designed and implemented by the New York City Department of Citywide Administrative Services (DCAS). The combined yearlong efforts of DCAS Commissioner Martha Hirst and her staff resulted in a modern home for DJJ.
