DJJ Holds Women's History Month Roundtable With Relationship Experts and Authors Judy Bolton and Wendy Bolton Floyd

The event featured Yahoo and Lifetime Movie Channel relationship experts Judy Bolton and Wendy Bolton Floyd.

Last year, the sisters authored and published the insightful and popular book 'When Did You Know... He Was Not The One?' Judy Bolton, a Columbia University graduate with a background in clinical psychotherapy and 25 years experience providing counseling, joined forces with her sister, Wendy Bolton Floyd, a writer and contributing columnist for Lifetime TV and Yahoo Personals, on an ambitious project to research and interview women across the country about what makes or breaks relationships between men and women.

During the course of writing their book the sisters attracted a great deal of media interest, impressing television and internet executives and fueling sales of their compelling tome.

For nearly two hours at DJJ's Women's History event, Judy Bolton and Wendy Bolton Floyd discussed their findings on successful relationships, identifying one's true calling and designing a successful and happy life, answering dozens of questions from an enthusiastic gathering of nearly 50 Department staff members.
