

Safety Registration Numbers Required

In order to accommodate the anticipated volume of safety registration applicants in the upcoming weeks, the safety registration deadline has been extended to December 1, 2009. Individuals and organizations performing or supervising construction will be required to have a new Safety Registration Number as of December 1, 2009. This new requirement applies to people or entities conducting the following work:

- A New Building permit, other than 1-, 2- and 3-family homes
- An alteration permit or an enlargement more than 25% of an existing building's floor area
- An alteration permit to add three or more stories to an existing building
- An alteration permit for demolition or alteration of more than 50% of an existing building's floor area
- An alteration permit to remove one or more floors of an existing structure
- A demolition permit
- The placement of 2,000 cubic yards or more of concrete in connection with excavations, foundation or superstructure work

The Safety Registration Number requirement depends upon the type of work being done:

Construction: For the work listed above (not required for registered General Contractors for 1-, 2- and 3 family homes)

Demolition: For any full or partial demolition listed above

Concrete: For concrete work listed above

Registration and renewal fee will be \$80 for each endorsement.

The revised LIC7 form and instructions are available on our website www.nyc.gov/buildings. **As of October 19, 2009 the Buildings Department will only accept Safety Registration Forms with a revision date of (9/09).**
