Whether they are illuminated or painted, or intended for advertising, business promotion or construction, signs are regulated by the Department of Buildings. Visit www.NYC.gov/buildings

to learn everything you need to know about <u>Advertising Signs on Sheds and Scaffolds</u>. This publication reviews the definitions and the relevant laws regarding advertising and non-advertising signs on these installations. A <u>printer-friendly</u> (81 kb-pdf) version is also available. There is also a brochure about <u>Storefront Signs</u> (366 kb-pdf). You can also find a <u>comprehensive list of requirements for construction signs</u>.
