ECB Violation Penalty Schedule

The most common type of violation issued by the Department of Buildings is called an <u>ECB</u> <u>Notice of Violation</u> because it can result in a hearing at the <u>Environmental Control Board</u> (ECB), an administrative court. The ECB Notice of Violation contains a notice that a property does not comply with applicable provisions of law.

Resolving an ECB violation imposes two obligations: (a) to pay a civil penalty and correct the violating condition, and (b) to file a <u>Certificate of Correction</u> (AEU-2) with the Department of Buildings at its main office either by mail or in person.
