Public Hearing for Proposed Rule of Impact Resistant Stairwells/Elevators

[Local Law 26 of 2004](#) (70 kb-pdf) implements recommendations from the World Trade Center Building Code Task Force. The Task Force was convened after September 11, 2001 to ensure that requirements, standards and practices in the design and construction of buildings incorporate emerging technologies to further the safety of tall buildings throughout the five boroughs. As mandated by law, the Buildings Department has drafted proposed revisions to Rule 32.
