Buildings Announces New Outdoor Sign Registration Program

On July 26, 2006, the NYC Department of Buildings announced new regulations for outdoor advertising signage. The new rules, effective August 25, 2006, enhance the Department's regulatory authority over billboards and are aimed at combating the proliferation of illegal signs near the City's major arterial highways and parks. The new regulations implement provisions of Local Laws 14/2001 (41 kbpdf) and 31/2005 (30 kb-pdf).

Once the new rules go into effect, owners of signs that are found to be non-compliant may incur penalties up to \$25,000 per day and the signs may be removed by the City. Reminder_____

Local Law 26 of 2004 (70 kb-pdf) required all high-rise office buildings to install photoluminescent markings in emergency exit stairwells by July 1, 2006. If you own or manage a high-rise office building and you have not filed the certification form (LL 26/04-1) with the Department of Buildings, you may be subject to violations and possible fines.
