### New Supported Scaffold Law - Local Law 52



On November 19th, Local Law 52 of 2005 went into effect requiring a permit for any supported scaffold that is 40 feet or more in height. In addition to permit requirements, workers must take Department of Buildings reviewed training courses. A certificate of training can be obtained from Occupational Safety Hazardous Administration (OSHA), an OSHA-trained or certified provider, or a provider of a training program regarding scaffold safety that has been reviewed by the Buildings Department. This new law

will help promote the safety of workers at sites. Read the <u>fact sheet</u> (38 kb-pdf) for more information.

### eFiling: The Quickest Most Efficient Filing Process

<u>eFiling</u> is the easiest way for licensed electricians to submit electrical applications and for licensed master plumbers, fire suppression piping contractors, oil burner installers and sign hangers to file select no-change permit renewals online. Since its inception, over 1,400 licensed electricians have registered to use eFiling. If you are interested in registering but don't want to do it on your own, bring your seal when you visit us to renew your electrical license and a Buildings Department representative will walk you through the process. ### **Easier House Connection Sign-offs**

All successful house connection jobs that are inspected by the Buildings Department House Connection Unit, in the Bronx, Brooklyn and Queens, will be signed-off directly in <u>BISWeb</u> by the House Connection Unit. This service enhancement eliminates the need to provide a hard copy of the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) sign-off card to the Plumbing Unit. If the inspection is conducted by a Unit or Agency other than the House Connection Unit, a DEP sign-off card is still required. View the <u>service announcement</u> (24 kb-pdf) for more information.
