Local Law 11/98 Facade Inspection Deadline Approaching



The Local Law 11/98 Facade Inspection deadline is February 21, 2007 and will not be extended. All LL 11/98 Facade Reports must be submitted to the Department of Buildings by the deadline. View some helpful hints (29 kb) to ensure your report is accepted. Don't wait until the deadline to file. File today!

Calling All Electricians!

While your current electrical license remains valid until December 31, 2007, you now have the opportunity change the expiration date. As of April 1, 2007, you may renew your electrical license and change the expiration date to your birth date. Updated: Cranes & Derricks On-Site Waivers

Manhattan Streamlines the Professionally Certified Post Approval Amendment (PAA) Process

To ensure your folders are always up-to-date, the Manhattan Borough Office will retain the original copy of all PAAs filed for all professionally certified jobs. Effective February 12, 2007, approval of a professionally certified PAA will require the applicant and/or filing representative to sign and return the PAA document to the DEAR clerk.

New Manhattan Plumbing Counter Hours

The Plumbing Division is opening its counter daily to make it easier for you to do business with us. Effective immediately, the Plumbing counter is open five days a week from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. If you require technical assistance or have issues that were expedited by the industry manager or <u>borough commissioner</u>, you can speak to the <u>Plumbing Chief</u>, Assistant Chief or the Supervisor Monday through Friday from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
