Mayor Announces Implementation of Scaffold Task Force Recommendations



Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg today announced the first step in the City's plan to better protect workers on scaffolds, based on the recommendations of the Suspended Scaffold Worker Safety Task Force. Over the next four years the City will invest \$6 million dollars in implementing these recommendations, with \$4 million dedicated to the creation of a new scaffold safety unit within the Department of Buildings. The Unit will be comprised of inspectors, analysts and legal support and will conduct proactive, focused

Buildings & Finance Team Up to Combat SWO Violations



To deter owners and contractors from violating stop work orders (SWO), Buildings and the Department of Finance have teamed up to create a Stop Work Order Patrol, a team of Buildings inspectors and City sheriffs who proactively inspect sites where Stop Work Orders are in effect. In addition to this new interagency effort, recent legislation has been enacted that increases penalties for violating a SWO. View the service notice (24 kb-pdf) for more information.

Civil Penalties Increased for Working Without Permit

New Requirements for CN and Outrigger Beam Applications

Effective immediately, amendments and revisions to previously approved 2005 Cranes and Derricks on-site inspection applications (CD-4) and outrigger beam notification applications (CD-5) will no longer be accepted. Instead, new complete stand-alone 2007 applications with one copy of the approved 2005 application, including all amendments, letters and calculations must be submitted. Builders Pavement Plan Authorization (BBP-5) Requirements

When dropping off the Builders Pavement Plan Authorization form (BPP-5), please be sure to:

- Microfilm all plans prior to drop-off
- Submit photos of new building exteriors and unobstructed photos of roadways
- Sign and professionally seal the BPP-5

Public Hearing for Proposed Rule 48

A public hearing will be held March 1, 2007 to discuss Rule 48, the Construction Superintendent Rule. The proposed rule is intended to promote public safety by assuring construction sites are supervised by qualified people with the appropriate knowledge of construction and risk prevention.
