Amendments to the 2005 NEC Electrical Code





The NYC Amendment to the 2005 NEC Electrical Code Book is now available at the <u>CityStore</u>. The <u>Local Law 49 of 2006</u> (421 kb-pdf) amends the administrative code to adopt amendments to the 2005 edition of the National Electrical Code (NFPA 70). The amendments adapt the national standards to the special requirements of building

and construction in the City of New York. Together, the 2005 NEC and local amendments will comprise the 2007 Electrical Code of the City of New York and apply to work performed on and after January 1, 2007. Coming Soon: Upgrades and Expansions

Building on the success of <u>eFiling</u> for electrical applications and the Department's commitment to making it easier for the public to file applications, eFiling will be expanded to the 80,000 job applications the Department receives annually. Launching in late 2007, this system will provide customers with a guided, simple way to create and manage job applications through their eFiling account. By using the most up-to-date information from BIS, customers will be alerted to any potential issues with applications online, saving valuable time and allowing for faster application processing. If you haven't already, <u>register now</u> to be eligible to enjoy the benefits of eFiling, including:

- Filing and printing electrical permit applications online
- Renewing and printing select "no-change" permits
