Mayor Bloomberg Signs Bills Enhancing Safety for Scaffold Workers

On Tuesday, April 17, 2007, Commissioner Patricia J. Lancaster joined Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg as he signed three bills aimed at enhancing safety for suspended scaffold workers. The new legislation is the result of the recommendations made by the <u>Scaffold Safety Worker Task Force</u>, a group created by the Administration to develop concrete steps to minimize suspended scaffold-related injuries and develop outreach strategies to inform workers of safe
