Mayor Bloomberg and Buildings Commissioner Lancaster Announce Completion of the Proposed New NYC Construction Codes



On Thursday, May 3, 2007, Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg and Buildings Commissioner Patricia J. Lancaster announced the submission of a landmark modernization of the Building Code, the first since 1968, to the City Council for review and consideration. The proposal overhauls all aspects of the City's construction codes, including the Building Code, setting new standards and rules in order to emphasize safety, efficiency and sustainability. Construction Safety Week 2007



Last week, Buildings held <u>Construction Safety Week</u>, to heighten awareness of safe and compliant construction practices. The week was kicked-off with the announcement of an <u>Alliance</u> with the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) to formalize a commitment to crosstrain inspectors, share data, and conduct joint outreach to workers. Also during Safety Week, Buildings and OSHA along with the Mayor's Office of Immigrant Affairs, teamed up at the <u>Bay Parkway Worker Center</u> to distribute safety information to workers and to talk to them about their rights to a safe work site. <u>Other Safety Week events</u> included educational forums on safe demolitions, structural assessments, and the proposed safety enhancements in the new NYC Construction Codes. Wrapping the week up, Commissioner Lancaster announced the new <u>Construction Superintendent Rule</u>, which will ensure that construction sites are supervised by qualified individuals with the appropriate knowledge of construction and risk-prevention. Electrical Pre-filing Phase Out

With the addition of improved technology and new services such as <u>eFiling</u>, pre-filing for Electrical permits has been phased out and pre-filed applications (BEC-56) are no longer accepted.
