B-SCAN Launches in Bronx

On June 25, 2007, the Bronx Borough Office is launching the Buildings Scan and Capture Application Network (<u>B-SCAN</u>)

document management system. B-SCAN will scan virtually all contents of job folders (with the exception of plans) to enable electronic processing, storage and online retrieval of documents associated with New Building and Alteration job filing applications. Did you know that the escalator began as an amusement ride in Coney Island in 1895? Currently, there are approximately 3,000 escalators throughout New York City that fall under the jurisdiction of the Department of Buildings. Escalators are inspected twice a year by the Department's <u>Elevator Division</u>. Stay safe while riding escalators by following these <u>safety tips</u>.
