B-SCAN Launched in Brooklyn!

On July 30, 2007, the Brooklyn Borough Office launched the Building Scan and Capture Application Network (B-SCAN). B-SCAN scans virtually all contents of job

folders (with the exception of architectural plans) for the electronic processing, storage and online retrieval of documents associated with New Building and Alteration applications. Already implemented in Staten Island and the Bronx, B-SCAN will be live citywide in the coming months. For more information, view the press release.

Electrical Guidelines for Sidewalk Sheds

Dedicated to Safety

To ensure the safety of workers and the public, the Buildings Department requires that all sidewalk shed electrical installations be installed by a New York City Licensed Electrician and must be done in accordance with the NEC 2005 Electrical Code and the NYC Amendments to the 2005 NEC (<u>Local Law 49/2006</u>) (421 kb-pdf). Exams for Hoist Machine Operators

Information You Need To Know

At the end of the year, the Buildings Department will begin administering exams for Hoist Machine Operator (HMO) Class A and Class B licenses, replacing the Department of Citywide Administrative Services. Currently, the Department is looking for sites where the practical exams

Construction Superintendent Registration Has Begun

Dedicated to Safety

Registration to become a Construction Superintendent began July 5, 2007. As of January 1, 2008, all new building and demolition projects 14 stories and below will need to be supervised by a registered Construction Superintendent. Individuals already serving as a Construction Superintendent on a permit (New Building, Demolition or Alteration Type 1) that was active between January 7, 2007 and July 5, 2007, can <u>register online</u>.
