Height of Noise Barrier Fences Increased

Information You Need To Know

Under the Department of Environmental Protection's new Noise Code, enacted July 1, 2007, noise barrier fences and construction fences are permitted to rise to 15 feet to act as noise barriers. To facilitate compliance with the new noise rules, the Buildings Department will allow fences up to 15 feet as long as they meet certain requirements. New Sewer Connection Approvals for Jamaica Rezoning Plan

Information You Need To Know

Pending action by City Council, beginning September 11, 2007, all sewer connections from commercial, manufacturing and residential buildings occupied by four or more families in the Jamaica Rezoning Plan must be reviewed by Department of Environmental Protection before the Department of Buildings will process a permit. New Elevator Permit Posting Requirement



To increase the transparency and standardization of elevator permits, beginning September 10, 2007 the Buildings Department will require all new elevator permits be posted so they are visible to the public. Local Law 10/81 Deadline Approaching For Elevators & Escalators

If your building has one or more elevators and/or escalators, you must have them inspected by September 15, 2007 and file an inspection report with the Department of Buildings by October 1, 2007. For questions, please contact the Buildings Department's Elevator Division.

Did You Know? ____

Did you know that on August 13, 2007, the New York Housing Court imposed a civil penalty of \$50,000 for elevator violations at 98 Morningside Avenue in Manhattan? The case, which was prosecuted by attorneys from the Department of Housing Preservation and Department (HPD), is the product of a new enforcement program launched by the Buildings Department and HPD to bring buildings with a history of elevator problems into compliance.

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
