In the coming weeks, the Manhattan Borough Office will be launching the Buildings Scan and Capture Application Network. <u>B-SCAN</u> scans virtually all documents (except architectural plans) associated with

New Building and Alteration permit applications for the public and professionals to retrieve online. B-SCAN has already been implemented in <u>Staten Island</u>, the <u>Bronx</u>, <u>Brooklyn</u> and <u>Queens</u>. Annual Boiler Inspection Reports Due Soon

Information You Need To Know

Owners of buildings with boilers installed (residential properties with 6 or more units, mixed use buildings, and commercial buildings) are required to file an <u>Annual Boiler Inspection Report</u> along with a \$30 filing fee by December 31st. Please contact the <u>Boiler Division</u> with any questions about this requirement.
