Special Enforcement Plan Update



On October 26, 2007, Buildings Commissioner <u>Patricia J. Lancaster</u> released a progress report on implementation of the Special Enforcement Plan to raise the bar for construction standards citywide. Announced by Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg in July, phase one of the Enforcement Plan formed new multidisciplinary enforcement units, focuses resources on identifying and holding repeat offenders accountable and increases oversight over the professional certification program. The progress

New Technical Report: Statement of Responsibility (TR-1) Form

To ensure accurate submission and certification of required controlled inspections, the Buildings Department launched a revised, streamlined <u>TR-1</u> Form, on October 31, 2007. As part of the Special Enforcement Plan and to ensure compliant development, beginning November 5, 2007, the Manhattan Borough Office will review all New Building (NB) applications submitted under the Professional Certification Program for common zoning issues. Once the filing fee payment is made, a Plan Examiner will review the professionally-certified job application to identify potential zoning problems before Buildings processes the application and issues permits. Dedicated to Safety

To ensure construction sites are supervised by qualified professionals, beginning January 2, 2008, all New Building and Demolition applications for buildings up to and including 14 stories will be required to have a registered Construction Superintendent named in section 9a of the <u>PW-2</u> Form. On July 5, 2008, this requirement will be extended to all New Building and Demolition applications for one-, two- and three-family homes.
