New Safety Standards Introduced For Microturbines



On December 3, 2007, Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg announced <u>new regulations</u> (68 kb-pdf) for the installation of microturbine systems in residential and commercial buildings, making New York City the first US city to establish safety standards for the use of microturbines in these building types. Microturbines are highly efficient turbine generators that recover and reuse the wasted heat of their own combustion

process, after producing electricity and heat for a building, to provide energy for other building operations. These new standards enable building owners to take advantage of microturbine technology and will help the City achieve its energy efficiency goals outlined in <u>PlaNYC</u>. Lancaster announced that the Buildings Department <u>Bronx Borough Office</u>, led by Bronx Borough Commissioner <u>Marshall Kaminer</u>, issued more permits, increased the number of inspections, and audited more professionally-certified applications in October as compared to

October 2006. The numbers were published in the Building Understanding, Integrity, Leadership and Dedication (BUILD) Report, a monthly report that provides a citywide overview of the Department's performance delivering services and enforcing the Building Code and Zoning Resolution. Did you know that construction jobs in New York City increased 5.4% over the past fiscal year? According to the <u>U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics</u>, New York City saw this increase in construction hires as the number of construction jobs decreased 1.4% nationally in the same period of time. During this time, overall construction-related fatalities also significantly decreased.
