## eFiling to Replace PC Filing February 19



On Tuesday, February 19, we're fully launching our expanded eFiling system to include construction permit application filings. Because of this expansion, as of February 19, PC filing will no longer be available. All PC Filing applications must be completed and uploaded at DEAR by February 15. # Special Inspections Qualifications

To help our customers transition from controlled inspections to the special inspections required under our <u>New NYC Construction Codes</u>, we have developed an easy-to-use <u>guide</u> (341 kb-pdf). This guide outlines the proposed qualifications needed to perform the various types of special inspections, which become effective under the New Codes in July 2008. # New Customer Service Call Center for Boiler Questions

### **New Energy Code Requirements**

The Buildings Department is extending the Energy Conservation Construction Code of New York State requirement to file an energy analysis to all Alteration 2 and Alteration 3 applications. Beginning February 19, the borough offices will only accept the newly-revised PW-1 Form, which must include the <u>ECCCNYS</u> Professional Compliance Statement in Section 10. ## **New NYC Construction Codes Effective Dates**



Construction professionals will be able to use the <u>New</u> <u>NYC Construction Codes</u> July 1, 2008, and the New Codes will be mandated for new construction projects July 1, 2009. During this interim period, builders may use either the New NYC Construction Codes or the

<u>1968 Building Code</u> to prepare new construction plans. However, certain administrative provisions of the New Codes must be adhered to beginning July 1, 2008.
