Buildings Department Announces Scaffold Safety Initiative



On February 20, Buildings Commissioner Patricia Lancaster launched a 30-day citywide crackdown on unsafe supported scaffolds and sidewalk sheds - more than 1,500 of which will be inspected. The inspections are the first step in the Department's new Safety Analysis and Field Evaluation (SAFE) Scaffold & Shed comprehensive package Initiative. а of increased enforcement, operational and regulatory initiatives, and design improvements to increase scaffold and sidewalk shed safety.

Buildings Department Expands Special Enforcement Plan



On February 13, Buildings Commissioner Patricia Lancaster launched Phase II of the Department's <u>Special Enforcement Plan</u> to raise the bar for construction standards citywide. Additional enforcement resources are being allocated to crack down on illegal after-hours construction, unsafe interior demolitions, and low-rise site safety - together building upon the new enforcement and operational tactics

implemented during <u>Phase I</u>. Phase II includes a \$1 million investment that dedicates 21 staff lines to three new enforcement teams and one new research group: the After-Hours Inspection Team, the Interior Demolitions Team, the Low-Rise Site Safety Team, and the Professional Certification Qualifications Group. Fully-Expanded eFiling Now Available



We've now fully launched our <u>expanded eFiling system</u> to include construction permit application filings. This expanded system enables applicants to use eFiling and its electronic interview-style process to prepare the new <u>PW-1 Form</u> online for initial and subsequent filings. We've already improved upon our new PW-1 Form, which had plot maps as page five. Thanks to your input, we've now made the plot map a separate form to be completed outside of the eFiling process.

New Safety Provision for Animated Signs



The <u>New NYC Construction Codes</u> include a new safety provision for animated signs. Appendix H (Section <u>BC-H108</u>) of the 2008 Building Code requires animated devices on outdoor signs be equipped with fail-safe provisions to prevent moving parts from falling.

New NYC Construction Codes Publication

The International Code Council will be publishing the <u>New NYC Construction Codes</u>. Until the ICC's publication is finalized and available, we have provided easy access to the New Codes in our website's <u>NYC Construction Codes</u> section. Coming Soon: PENS Enhancement

To make it easier and more efficient to do business with us, on April 1 we're enhancing our <u>Plan Examination Notification System</u> (PENS) to make scheduling plan exam appointments more efficient and even quicker through 311. Registered professionals and filing representatives who would like to take advantage of this enhancement must provide a PIN number and e-mail address to the Buildings Department by March 3, 2008 and can do so by filling out the <u>PENS Submission</u> form (31 kb-pdf).

This enhancement was originally scheduled for March 25, but has been pushed back to April 1 to allow more time to provide this information to the Department. To
