New Registration for General Contractors



On April 1, Buildings Commissioner Patricia J. Lancaster launched a new registration program for general contractors. All general contractors seeking permits to erect one-, two-, or three-family homes are now required to register with the Department by October 31, 2008. After that date, only general contractors registered with the Buildings Department will be issued buildingpermits for these types of buildings. Unregistered individuals or entities found

building such homes after October 31, 2008 will be subject to violations, Stop Work Orders, criminal charges, and the seizure of vehicles and construction tools. As part of the annual Private Retaining Wall Inspection Program, which ends May 16, private property owners may call 3-1-1 to request retaining wall inspections. OSHA Grants

Information You Need To Know

On March 26, the <u>U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration</u> announced that it is seeking applications for <u>Susan Harwood Training Grants</u>. OSHA awards grants to nonprofit organizations to provide training and education programs on safety and health topics for employers and employees. The deadline to <u>apply for a grant</u> is May 23. ECB Violation Reclassification

To enhance our enforcement, we are streamlining the Environmental Control Board violation process to consolidate duplicate codes and to reclassify violations and penalties to focus on serious offenses and offenders. These changes comport with the <u>New NYC Construction</u> <u>Codes</u> Classification of Violations and are the subject of rulemaking by the Buildings Department and the Environmental Control Board. On April 14 at 5:00 pm, a public hearing on the proposed rules will be held on the 10th floor at the Environmental Control Board, located at 66 John Street in Manhattan.

Citywide Inspection of Scaffolds and Sheds



On April 4, Buildings Commissioner Lancaster announced the results of the Buildings Department's 30-day citywide <u>inspection sweep</u> to crack down on unsafe supported scaffolds and sidewalk sheds. Of the 1,654 sites inspected as part of the sweep, 28% of the inspected supported scaffolds and sidewalk sheds did not comply with the City's Building Code. Coming Soon! Drywell Audit Program Expansion

To better ensure construction professionals are meeting Building Code requirements for safe and proper water drainage, we are expanding the Drywell Audit Program to Queens. Beginning April 21, all Queens site engineers must notify the Buildings Department 48 hours prior to digging a sand column and installing a drywell.
