Crane Sweep Update

Dedicated to Safety

The Buildings Department has completed its citywide safety inspection sweep of tower cranes and announced its findings April 17. The safety sweep's results found that 21 of 29 tower cranes installed and in use throughout the five boroughs passed inspection and complied with regulations. The eight tower cranes issued violations were immediately shut down and remained out of operation until the violations were corrected. New Checklist for Anti-Harassment Areas

Information You Need To Know

Beginning April 28, applicants seeking New Building, Alteration or Subdivision permits in the Hudson Yards, West Chelsea, Garment Center, Greenpoint-Williamsburg and Clinton Special District will be required to submit a new Anti-Harassment Area checklist with the application. In the Clinton Special District, applicants must indicate on the checklist if the property is in the Preservation Area, Perimeter Area or Other Area and submit additional information. Retaining Wall Program

The Buildings Department has launched its annual Private Retaining Wall Inspection Program and is now offering visual examinations of private retaining walls to property owners without the threat of violations. Under this program, which ends May 16, private property owners may request inspections of their walls by calling 3-1-1. Changes Under the New Codes

Information You Need To Know

On July 1, 2008, certain administrative provisions, enforcement provisions and construction safeguards under the New NYC Construction Codes will go into effect. As a result, the Buildings Department has a number of corresponding rules and operational changes. In order to effectively transition to the New Codes and assist you in meeting the July 1 deadline, we will be providing information and updates regularly. License Reinstatement Change

Information You Need To Know

Beginning July 1, the Buildings Department will no longer reinstate licenses that have been expired for more than five years. Individuals with licenses expired more than five years must reapply for the license and meet the license's original requirements, including taking any necessary examinations. Street Tree Rezoning Amendment

Information You Need To Know

On April 30, the City Council will vote on whether to adopt the Street Tree Rezoning Amendment. This amendment would establish regulations that require planting street trees with all new developments, major enlargements and certain conversions. This proposed requirement would increase the street tree canopy, improve air quality and storm water management and support Mayor Bloomberg's PlaNYC initiative. Drywell Audit Program Expansion

Dedicated to Safety

To better ensure construction professionals are meeting Building Code requirements for safe and proper water drainage, we have expanded the Drywell Audit Program to Queens. All Queens site engineers must now notify the Buildings Department 48 hours prior to digging a sand column and installing a drywell.
