### Aggressive Legislative Agenda to Enhance Construction Site Safety



In a City Hall press conference on June 4, Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg, Speaker Christine C. Quinn and Acting Buildings Commissioner Robert D. LiMandri announced an aggressive legislative agenda that will equip the Buildings Department with additional oversight and enforcement tools to advance construction safety in New York City. The centerpiece of this comprehensive safety agenda focuses on the highest-risk construction operations and enhances oversight of general contractors

and the concrete and demolition trades. Once enacted, this legislation will empower the Buildings Department to track general contractors and concrete and demolition subcontractors by a mandatory safety control number - better enabling the Department to halt contractors who repeatedly and recklessly put the public and construction workers at risk. Beginning July 1, applicants will be required to file a number of new, revised forms. To provide applicants an opportunity to familiarize themselves with these revised forms, draft versions of the following forms are now available on our website: <u>PW1</u>, <u>Schedule A</u>, <u>Schedule B</u> and <u>TR1</u>.

In addition, both versions of the TR1 will remain available on our website after July 1, as the appropriate version to use depends upon the application's filing status with the Department. As the July 1, 2008 implementation of the <u>New NYC Construction</u> <u>Codes</u> nears, the Department is holding public hearings on upcoming Special Inspections and Approved Agency requirements. A public hearing on the proposed Special Inspections <u>Rule</u> will be held June 20, at 280 Broadway at 1:30pm, and a public hearing on the proposed Approved Agency <u>Rule</u> will be held June 23, at 280 Broadway at 2:00pm. ### **New Filing Representative ID**

The Buildings Department will be registering and issuing new filing representative identification cards, replacing the existing expediter cards. Beginning December 31, the Department will only issue filing representative cards, and filing representatives who fail to obtain one by December 31 will not be permitted to conduct business with the Department. With the upcoming New NYC Construction Codes implementation, Policy and Procedure Notices, Directives and Memoranda will be phased out and replaced by Buildings Bulletins. Buildings Bulletins will include code and zoning interpretations, bulletins from the <u>Office of</u> <u>Technical Certification and Research</u> and administrative and operational bulletins. These documents represent official Buildings Department policies and assist our customers and employees in following operational, technical and legal procedures.

### **General Contractor Registration**



The Buildings Department has launched a <u>new registration</u> program for general contractors seeking permits to erect one-, two- or three-family homes. This requirement goes into effect November 1, 2008, and it applies to all one-, two- and threefamily home general contractors, including contractors who already have a tracking number with a borough office. Old tracking numbers will be invalid beginning November 1. To

### Licensing Term and Fee Changes

Information You Need To Know Beginning July 1, Hoist Machine Operator, Master Fire Suppression Piping Contractor and Master Plumber license application fees are increasing. Licensees whose applications are processed after this date will receive a three-year license term, instead of the current one-year term. #### Site Safety Coordinator Certification



On June 2, the Department began certifying Site Safety Coordinators. Site Safety Coordinators will be responsible for supervising construction and demolition of 10- to 14- story buildings. To better process Site Safety Coordinator Certification applications, the Licensing Unit now provides extended service hours every Tuesday and Wednesday from 5:00pm to 7:00pm. Applicants may set an appointment by

### **Demolition Requirements**

The Buildings Department will not issue demolition permits unless the applicant has filed an <u>ACP-5</u> or <u>ASB-4</u> as part of the <u>demolition filing requirements</u> (21 kb-pdf). An <u>ACP-7</u> will not satisfy the filing requirements for a demolition permit.
