What's New

General Contractor Registration



Beginning November 1, 2008, all one-, two- and three-family home general contractors, including contractors who already have a tracking number, must be registered with the Licensing Unit to obtain a new building permit. Unregistered individuals or entities found building one-, two- or three-family homes after the registration deadline will be subject to violations, Stop Work Orders, criminal charges and the seizure

of vehicles and construction tools. For more information:

Buildings Department Hosts International Crane Conference



On October 16, Buildings Commissioner Robert LiMandri hosted an international conference on crane safety with more than 50 construction and public safety experts from the United States, Canada, and the United Kingdom to discuss crane safety protocols around the world. Held at the Department's headquarters in Lower Manhattan, the conference was the first of its kind in the country and serves as a major step forward in developing an ongoing worldwide dialogue among

responsible parties in the crane industry, including government regulators, crane owners, manufacturers, operators, contractors, engineers and riggers. View photos from the event.

New Regulations for HMO Class C Licenses

Information You Need To Know

On October 6, Commissioner LiMandri announced <u>strict new criteria</u> for individuals seeking to operate Class C hoist machines, also known as mobile cranes. As part of these new regulations, applicants must obtain certification from the National Commission for the Certification of Crane Operators (NCCCO). To assist with these new regulations, the Department has created a <u>fact sheet</u> (pdf) that details information about obtaining NCCCO certification.

New Requirements for Elevator Inspections

Information You Need To Know

To enhance elevator safety, the Department introduced several changes for elevator inspections with the implementation of the New NYC Construction Codes. Beginning January 1, 2009, elevator inspections <u>must comply with more stringent requirements</u> (pdf), including keeping a maintenance log and maintenance contractor record updated and readily available for all passenger elevators as well as following a new filing process.

The topic of the conference was "Codes & Regulations/Government Affairs." At the event, Commissioner LiMandri discussed ways to make construction safer and recent Department initiatives including its <u>Special Enforcement Plan</u>, <u>new crane</u>

regulations and its \$4 million investment to study high risk construction operations.
