To ensure documents are permanently archived and will not deteriorate over time, the Department is <u>enhancing BSCAN</u>, its internal document management system. The system is being upgraded to scan, capture and electronically store building plans, which will begin in Spring 2009.

#### **Elevator Inspections**

With the increased elevator inspection and filing requirements put in place by the new NYC Construction Codes, the Department is <u>allowing Inspectors</u> who have obtained Qualified Elevator Inspector (QEI) certification, but are not Department-licensed, to perform elevator inspections and tests in calendar year 2009.

The Department will begin auditing New Building and Alteration applications for compliance with the Energy Conservation Construction Code of New York State (ECCCNYS) in February 2009. Applications that do not meet or exceed these requirements will be issued objections and notices of revocation as appropriate. ### **Class C HMO License Documentation**

Dedicated to Safety

Individuals seeking to maintain a <u>Class C Hoist Machine Operator License</u> must provide documentation of certification from the National Commission for the Certification of Crane Operations (<u>NCCCO</u>) by September 30, 2009.
