New Safety Registration Numbers




To better monitor safety and compliance records, beginning October 1, 2009, individuals and organizations performing or supervising certain construction projects, including new building and demolition jobs, will be required to have a new <u>Safety</u> <u>Registration Number</u>. The Department will begin accepting applications for Safety Registration Numbers in Spring 2009.

In April and May, the Department will hold several <u>information sessions</u> to review the Department's licensing and registration requirements. These sessions will discuss the registration requirements for contractors, insurance tracking numbers and the new Safety Registration Number. The sessions will be held at Department headquarters in Manhattan at 280 Broadway, in the 6th floor conference room:

30 Day Deadline for Final Inspection Reports

Dedicated to Safety

To better monitor the quality and standard of work performed on projects not necessitating a new or revised Certificate of Occupancy, the Department now requires applicants to submit a final inspection report within <u>30 days</u> of performing the final inspection.

Proposed Rule Public Hearing

On April 20, 2009, a public hearing on proposed rule amendment <u>Chapter 3600, Subchapter Q,</u> <u>Section 3616-01</u> will be held at 9am in the 3rd Floor Conference Room at Department headquarters, located at 280 Broadway in Manhattan. This rule promotes public safety with respect to the fire protection of elevator hoist ways by providing design standards for the proper installation of sprinkler system components within the hoist ways and benefits the public by requiring a proven safety practice based upon a nationally recognized standard.

The Department will offer free trainings and informational seminars to help increase awareness of safe construction practices at the start of the new construction season.
