Notification for C-Hook & Outrigger Beam Use

Information You Need to Know


Licensed Master Riggers, Special Riggers and Sign Hangers <u>must notify</u> the Department of C-Hook and Outrigger Beam use prior to installation. Individuals must do so by providing the last four digits of their Social Security number and Rigger ID number to a Buildings Call Center representative.

Site Safety Coordinator Certification

Information You Need To Know

All certified Site Safety Coordinators who wish to <u>renew</u> their certification must adhere to a new renewal process and mail in the <u>LIC2 form</u>, a copy of the Site Safety Manager refresher course completion certificate, a passport-sized photo and payment.

Tax Abatements for Going Green



New York State recently passed legislation that provides property tax abatements for the installation of a green roof or a solar electric-generating system to eligible applicants. On May 20, 2009, the Buildings Department will hold a public hearing on a proposed rule amendment to <u>section 101-02</u> of Title 1 of the Rules of the City of New York related to the submission of construction documents. The hearing will be held at 10am in the 6th floor conference room at Department headquarters at 280 Broadway in Manhattan.

Proposed Rule Public Hearing

Information You Need To Know

On May 19, 2009, the Buildings Department will hold a public hearing on a proposed rule amendment to add Chapter 8000 and Section 8000-01 to Title 1 of the Official Compilation of the Rules of the City of New York. This rule sets forth the criteria for the approval of building water conservation plans in accordance with the Plumbing Code, which permits the use of waterless urinals only as part of an approved building water conservation plan. The hearing will be held at 9am in the 6th floor training room at Department headquarters at 280 Broadway in Manhattan.

Safety Registration Numbers

Dedicated to Safety

To better monitor safety and compliance records, beginning October 1, 2009, individuals and organizations performing or supervising construction will be required to have a new <u>Safety</u> Registration Number.

New Requirements for Class C HMO License

Licensed <u>Class C Hoisting Machine Operators</u> seeking to maintain their license must provide documentation of NCCCO certification by October 1, 2009.

Electrical License Fee Changes

Did you know that the City Council adopted a <u>Department of City Planning</u> amendment to the Zoning Resolution requiring secure, enclosed bicycle parking in new multi-family residential, community facility, and commercial buildings? The amendment provides bicycle parking and storage in more buildings and
