What's New



The Department is now issuing <u>Safety</u> <u>Registration Numbers</u>. Individuals and organizations performing or supervising certain construction projects must secure a registration number by October 1. This requirement applies even for those who already have a tracking number.

To obtain a registration number, applicants need to file the <u>LIC7 form</u>. Please view our How-to <u>Guide</u>, and <u>Frequently Asked Questions</u> for more information. We've also created a <u>chart</u> that outlines when general contractor registration, safety registration and insurance tracking numbers are required.

Record Room Service Changes

Making it Easier

Beginning June 1, permitted folders <u>must be requested</u> from the Record Room in each borough office by 1:00pm. Folders will no longer be required when requesting Temporary Certificates of Occupancy and Certificates of Occupancy. Instead, applicants must submit a completed <u>PW7 form</u>.

Assistant Commissioner Speaks at Fire Safety Symposium

On Monday, July 13, Assistant Commissioner for Technical Affairs and Code Development James Colgate, RA, will lead a panel discussion on 9/11 World Trade Center evacuation studies as part of the fourth-annual International Symposium on Human Behaviour in Fire. Assistant Commissioner Colgate will moderate issues associated with the fire safety design of buildings, focusing on evacuation dynamics and how the ergonomic study of egress informs building regulation. The 4th International Symposium on Human Behaviour in Fire takes place July 13th - 15th in Cambridge, England.

Deadline to Complete OSHA Class

Dedicated to Safety All workers at "major buildings" (as defined by the new Codes) are required to complete a 10-hour construction safety course approved by the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration by July 1, 2009.
